

PARISH TOWN HALL MEETING—I do want to keep

the parish abreast on the improvements planned for the Church and the use of other church properties. I am going to summarize my notes for the Town Hall Meeting on Wednesday. Please note that the bulletin must be submitted on Tuesday so this is being written without the benefit of feedback from the meeting.

~Church improvements: repair of the trim around the top of both the church and rectory and the painting of both buildings should start this week. Be mindful we are changing the colors to better match the frontal brick and what it looked like on the 100th anniversary—the trim will be a maroon color and the rest a gold color. The bathroom in the rear of the church will be completed in a couple of weeks. The church, also, needs a new roof, but this will be done next year. We will, also, replace the doors from the back ramp next year. The cost of these repairs is close to \$500,000.

~Mission: we are hopeful that the sale of the mission property will be completed this fall.

~At the last Town Hall Meeting, I spoke about building a much needed meeting room and kitchen in the old school, providing a couple of small meeting rooms, handicap accessibility to the convent, and a few handicap parking spaces. The cost of these improvements and repairs needed to the buildings was \$500,000+. This proposal was made before the new school building became available to us. The use of the parking area behind the convent was lost to us on April 1 which emphasized the need for our own parking area.

~The new proposal is to sell the old school and convent and keep the new school property. We are, also, in a unique time in Kingston history where we are told the old buildings are more sellable than newer buildings.

~For almost the same amount of money, we found that we could put in a parking area in the front of the new school for almost 50 cars by removing the playground. By putting in an elevator, we could make every room in the new school handicap accessible. This would give the parish 8 classrooms/meeting rooms, 2 conference rooms for up to 15, the large meeting room downstairs for 150+ with a kitchen already there, and a ground floor gym. In addition, we can place the religious education and parish offices there. All this completely handicap accessible with parking. I, also, propose to put in a daily Mass chapel.

~The estimated cost to do all of this including renovating the bathrooms for more adult use and installing new ones on the gym level is \$600,000. The move and putting the buildings for sale will cost at least \$100,000.

~The Archdiocese asked that we do a fundraiser in the fall to raise funds for these improvements. Everyone guaranteed that every cent raised would go to the parish.

~The move to the new school will be done in stages. Religious Education will begin in September there, and their offices will be moved there over the summer. All parish groups and meetings will be moved there over the summer so that the other buildings can be cleaned out for the sale. Installation of the elevator will take place next spring as well as the chapel and parish offices.

~Realize that when this is done, we will save an incredible amount on utilities and repairs annually. This year we paid as much on utilities for the convent and the Religious Education office as KCS paid for the new school building! This is not counting the old school building.

~All this will make for a very busy year, but it is exciting in that we will be able to have an easily accessible building for parish groups and functions!!


NEWS ABOUT MONSIGNOR WILLIAM WILLIAMS
