BASILICA, CATHEDRAL OR SHRINE

Different church buildings serve different purposes. Basilicas are traditionally churches that have a historical and spiritual importance, such as St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. The ancient Romans originally used them to house kings or judges. Later, Christians used the style for places to worship God, the King of Kings. In the Archdiocese of New York, St. Patrick's Old Cathedral is a Basilica.

~A cathedral is the chief church in a diocese and is where the bishop presides. The name "cathedral" comes from the word cathedra, which is Latin for "the chair." This refers to the bishop's chair, which represents his authority.

~A shrine is a sacred place where a saint's relic is preserved, an apparition took place or a place to encourage a specific devotion.
