

A Word from Father...

Dear Friends,

It has been a busy week for wildlife sightings here in Spokane for Raz and me. Turkeys abound up here on the South Hill,



Beyond the fowl, though, the smell of skunk sometimes permeates the air on these hot summer nights and deer regularly ramble through my neighborhood on the North Side...sometimes a herd of seven or eight will be ambling along the side streets looking for fresh flowers in nearby gardens to munch on. Last Sunday, as we were driving out of the church parking lot, a mangy coyote was lollygagging its way up the 10th Ave. hill from Sherman; I was very happy Raz was in the car with me and not out on the lawn sniffing the other dogs' pmail. But the biggest sighting of all was that same night; we were out on the patio in my backyard just enjoying the cool of the evening. Razzie suddenly stood at attention, pointing at a creature coming out from between the back of the garage and the cyclone fence that separates my yard from the neighbor's. I thought it was a big gray cat so wasn't alarmed when Raz went after it at full speed, barking up a ferocious storm. The "cat" disappeared and I called Raz back to me; he returned feeling quite triumphant. Then about ten minutes later, he goes back on high alert, this time pointing at the open gate into the back yard from the driveway. I see the "cat" again sticking its nose into the yard, but in the dark still thought it was just a harmless domestic pet from somewhere in the neighborhood. As Raz took off like a laser beam for the intruder, it turned and ran and then I saw it: a long fluffy tail with stripes up and down: that "cat" was a big, fat, ugly, marauding, vicious raccoon who, if it had decided to turn on him as my fearless pal gave chase, would have made of Raz a Yorkshire pudding for sure! I immediately called Raz back to me...and fortunately, he is mostly an obedient dog...so he did give up the chase and returned, even more proud of himself than before.

So now I have to be more careful with the freedom I give Raz, both here at the church and at home; if it's not coyotes, then it's raccoons!

There must be some kind of spiritual message in all this, so let me think for a moment....hmmm...

I know: Life is wonderful and filled with many beautiful things...but there are, still and all, dangers out there so balancing our freedom to enjoy life's good things with a bit of caution and a light dose of discipline is the name of the game.
