## Holy Week Chrism Mass

The faithful of the Diocese of Spokane are invited to the Chrism Mass which will be celebrated at 5:15 pm on Tuesday, March 27 at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lourdes. Bishop Daly will be joined by the priests of the diocese for this annual blessing of Holy Oils. The name of this Mass comes from the Sacred Chrism which is one of the oils to be blessed and then used for celebrations of Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination to the Priesthood. The other oils to be blessed are the Oil of the Sick And the Oil of Catechumens. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.



"Education is the foundation of everything," says Andrise, who's been a first-grade teacher at a small Catholic school for 11 years, the same school she attended from first through sixth grade, in the community she calls home in northern Haiti. Andrise says the opportunities at Notre Dame set the course for her life, but a lot has changed since she was a student. New teaching techniques and resources are changing how students learn—and how teachers teach. "We use poems, dances, songs—all sorts of activities to help the students improve their literacy," she says. CRS, working with the Catholic Education Commission in Haiti, is leading the way. Every student receives a new workbook to practice reading and writing. This is a big change from before, when students had to copy notes from the board. "Now, all the students are able to learn at the same time," Andrise says.

## A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

With today's celebration of Palm Sunday we have begun well this most important week in our Church life. Holy Week has a place of special devotion to Christians everywhere and that certainly includes we who are Catholic. There is a solemnity and seriousness about these days that is unlike anything else we commemorate as Jesus' followers. It has always been so. Scholars tell us that the "core" of the Gospel stories, that is the first to be remembered, retold, and eventually written down, were the accounts of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection; the other stories and sayings of Jesus were added on to that core proclamation.

In our Catholic tradition, we join in proclaiming this saving story not only in words, but also in liturgy. Each significant moment, each holy day and night in Jesus's passion is made available to us to experience anew in a living and present way through the extraordinarily beautiful liturgies of the week, and especially of the Triduum, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights.

On Holy Thursday evening, we join Jesus' apostles around the Passover table with the Lord and receive from his hands the bread blessed and broken, his Body, and the cup of blessing shared out, his Blood. We remember as well his extraordinary example of self-giving service in the Washing of the Feet, which he asks us to live in our own life. Quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament continues through the evening.

On Good Friday, we commemorate Jesus' passion and death with the proclamation of this core of the Gospel. We reverence the Cross upon which he gave himself up, and we share again Holy Communion before going out into the dark of the night with heavy hearts at what we have remembered.

On Holy Saturday, we gather again as night falls to bless the new fire of creation, and the delicate flame of the Paschal Candle. We retell the story of salvation through seven readings from the Scriptures, we celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation, and once again, with the fullness of joy we celebrate the Risen Lord's presence among us in the Eucharist as we do again on Easter morning.

Don't miss out on these powerful celebrations of our faith. Please join us for these holy feasts!
