Our Sacred Heart Parish Adult Spiritual Formation Groups have begun their new sessions! Please feel free to join us.



A Word from Father...

Dear Friends:

Over the past several weekends and this weekend as well, we've been blessed by the beautiful words of Saint Paul's first



letter to the Corinthians. From his eloquent "ode to love" ("...love is patient; love is kind...), to today's powerful defense of the resurrection of the dead, Paul makes it clear that he was passionate about his faith in Jesus and the spiritual and moral demands that faith places on all who believe in Jesus. His mission to the Gentiles was never easy; to "translate" the Jewish spiritual concepts that underpin Jesus' story into something understandable by a Greek or Roman was a huge challenge, and then following that by keeping the small communities of believers that he founded on the right track, having available to him for the most part nothing more than a letter or two, was no easy thing either. Both his initial presence among those first believers and his follow-up letters had to be passionate or communities like that in Corinth would never have survived. The fact that his letters were prized, protected, reproduced, and shared widely over the next century and that we read them even today is evidence aplenty that he succeeded indeed.

Paul would not have been an easy person to live and work



with. One rather suspects that his passion for Christ also made him a person who brooked no nonsense and tolerated little in the way of dissent. Perhaps he was a bit on the prickly side. At one point, he writes, "You *stupid* Galatians! Who has bewitched you who saw with your own eyes the image of Jesus Christ crucified!" (Gal. 3:1).

Today's reading from 1 Corinthians 15, is a case in point: evidently some in the community were questioning whether there would be life after death, a concept perhaps difficult for the Greek mind to wrap itself around. Paul responds vehemently that Jesus' resurrection and the promise of life beyond the grave for those who follow him are inextricably linked: you cannot have one without the other. If you don't believe in a greater life beyond this life, then how can you believe in Christ Risen from the dead? If you don't believe in Christ Risen from the dead, then your faith in Jesus is pointless and you are no better than a pagan! I bet the folks who were propagating that point of view felt pretty small and sheepish when that was read aloud in their community gathering for the first time! He ends his teaching with utter clarity for the Corinthians and for us:

"But now, CHRIST HAS BEEN RAISED FROM THE DEAD, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep!" End of discussion!.
