Dear Friends,

As we begin this Holy Week with today's celebration of **Passion Sunday**, we enter into a time set aside by God for us to draw near to the very Being of the our Creator. "What is God like?" we are often asked and all that we celebrate in the coming eight days speak to us precisely of God's nature and character. Through our personal prayer, our reflection on the mysteries of our own lives, and most especially, through the liturgies of the **Holy Triduum**, (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil), we are immersed in the nature of God by walking as one with Jesus our brother.

On the evening of **Holy Thursday**, the Liturgy of the Lord's Supper recalls to memory the first Passover meal of the Hebrews as they were about to walk away from Egyptian slavery, through a dangerous desert, and finally on into the Promised Land. God is revealed as the God who hears the cries of the poor and *acts* to save them. That Passover meal resonates in the Gospel narrative from John of Jesus' Last Supper, where the saving compassion of God is made flesh in Jesus and especially made visible in Jesus' washing of the feet of his disciples. Our immersion into this act of humble self-giving touches us so deeply because here in Jesus' bended knee and tender and reverent washing of feet, we know God. The Eucharist follows naturally wherein the unleavened Passover Bread and the simple cup of Passover Wine become the paramount signs of the ultimate self-sacrifice Jesus will make on Friday upon stony Calvary. In breaking this Bread and sharing this Cup, we join him in the sacrifice that is to unfold before us on Friday. We end the evening in silent prayer before the Lord's own Body we see again what God is like: God is humble self-giving.

On **Good Friday**, the liturgy continues in shocked silence for we know that this is the day when Jesus was brutally murdered. The Passion narrative from Luke's Gospel is proclaimed. We venerate his Cross. We share communion in him. We depart in silence and continue our fast through the night.

On **Holy Saturday**, "the mother of all liturgies", the Easter Vigil, calls us back to the church as night falls. The darkness of night and coldness of death are pushed back by the warmth and delicate light of the primordial fire that represents the heart of God, the Creator of all that is. The flame gently comes to rests upon the Easter Candle, the great symbol of Christ who's giving up of himself to brutal death now brings gracious light to us all. The light spreads to us and from us! The Easter Hymn is proclaimed, and the history of salvation as well. "Glorias" fill us to overflowing, the sacraments of initiation are celebrated, gifts are offered, the Eucharist is prayed, we are blessed by a multitude of *Alle...ias* cascading from the heavens into our hearts!

Christ is risen...and we with him!

This is what God is like!
