FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 9:26-31

Paul the Apostle came to Jerusalem, where the other disciples were afraid of him. Then they learned that the Lord had spoken to Paul and he had preached openly in Damascus. When they learned that someone wanted to kill him, they protected him because they fully believed he had converted.

Second Reading: I John 3:18-24

John clearly states that we must love one another. All people who believe in Jesus Christ can show their faith only through their actions. If people believe in Jesus and love one another as he commanded us, they prove that they are true believers in Christ.

Gospel: John 15:1-8

Jesus compares himself to a vine, and compares his father to the vine-grower. He explains how God prunes the barren branches so that the rest might yield more fruit. He reminds them that apart from himself, his followers could not bear fruit.

From the Pastor's Desk...

My Dear Brother and Sisters,

During the long Easter Season, in our liturgical celebrations we hear extensively the resurrection narratives from the Gospels. We hear about the prefiguration of the suffering and death of the Messiah foretold in the Old Testament Readings. We also hear extensively from the Acts of the Apostles about the newly formed Church and its growth under the preaching and guidance of the Apostles. This is fabulous. But we do not hear a word about Mary. Have you ever asked the question why there is no mention of our Blessed Mother in the midst of all the activities of the early Church?

The last clear reference to the Blessed Mother in the Gospel is in John 19:25-27. "Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home."

The next mention of our Blessed mother is in the first chapter of Acts of the Apostles (Acts 1:13-14). St. Luke makes a simple mention of the presence of our Blessed Mother among those gathered in the upper room after they return from the scene of Ascension. "When they entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Mathew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers."

Here is a woman who was greeted by the Angel as "Hail full of Grace," who conceived and gave birth to the Son of God and who stood with him in his life, death and resurrection for the salvation of mankind. It is surprising that those who wrote about the resurrection and the early Church made her a silent presence. But God has been using her as His best instrument in bringing grace after grace to humanity for the last two thousand years. She is the best way to come to Jesus her Son. This is the month of May. Pray the family rosary every day in honor of our Blessed Mother and seek her love and protection. You will not be disappointed as St. Bernard proclaims in his prayer "The Memorare."
