On June 18, 2015, the Vatican issued *Laudato Si', Praise Be to You*, Pope Francis's encyclical on caring for creation. The phrase "praised be" is taken from a famous creation canticle by St. Francis of Assisi as he thanked God for the beauty of creation. At the core of Pope Francis's message is the idea of "integral ecology," – that how we relate to one another, especially the poor, and how we relate to the environment are intimately connected.
