First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

Samuel describes how all the tribes of Israel went to David in Hebron and said they were his bone and his flesh and it was he who led them back to Israel. The Lord told David he would be a shepherd to His people. David made an agreement with the elders and was anointed king.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20

Paul explains to the Colossians that God has made them fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light and that through the Son we have redemption and forgiveness of sin. He describes Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the head of the church and in Him all things hold together.

Gospel: Luke 23:35-43

Jesus is mocked by the crowd as he hung on the cross. Above him was an inscription that read "This is the king of the Jews." One of the men being crucified with Jesus tells Him to save them and Himself, while the other asks that he be remembered when Jesus is in his kingdom. Jesus said in reply, "Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

**“The Cross – The Ultimate Sign of
God’s Mercy”
by Msgr. Peter J. Vaghi**

Continued from last week

In Him, God has been thus revealed as a God of mercy. Mercy goes beyond the requirement of justice. In fact, God’s mercy is His justice, and God’s justice is His mercy. He justifies us through His mercy. In His mercy, God seeks to serve justice. Justice is tempered by mercy. Or, as Pope Francis wrote in his new book, *The Name of God is Mercy*, “With mercy and forgiveness, God goes beyond justice, He subsumes it and exceeds it in which we experience love, which is at the root of true justice” (p. 78). He is, after all, our redeemer. “God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions brought us to life with Christ” (Eph 2:4-5). He is our Savior. And that took place on the gibbet of the Cross as illumined by the resurrection. “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in His great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead” (1 Pt 1:3).

Stated in another way, Pope Francis wrote in *Misericordiae Vultus*, with which he opened this Year of Mercy: “If God limited himself to only justice, He would cease to be God, and would instead be like human beings who ask merely that the law be respected. But mere justice is not enough. Experience shows that an appeal to justice alone will result in its destruction. This is why God goes beyond justice with His mercy and forgiveness. Yet this does not mean that justice should be devalued or rendered superfluous. On the contrary: anyone who makes a mistake must pay the price. However, this is just the beginning of conversion, not its end, but one begins to feel the tenderness and mercy of God. God does not deny justice. He rather envelopes it and surpasses it with an even greater event in which we experience love as the foundation of true justice.... God’s justice is His mercy given to everyone as a grace that flows from the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ” (*Misericordiae Vultus*, No. 21). He ends this section of the bull by saying – and it is important to ponder – that: “Thus the Cross of Christ is God’s judgment on all of us and on the whole world, because through it He offers us the certitude of love and new life.”

Or as we hear in the first preface on the Passion of the Lord (from the Roman Missal): “For through the saving Passion of your Son the whole world has received a heart to confess the infinite power of our majesty, since by the wondrous power of the Cross your judgment on the world is now revealed and the authority of Christ crucified.”
