From the Pastor's Desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is already last week of July and there are no machines in the Church parking lot and no work started to get the planned elevator project going for the convent. I really thought by the beginning of July there would be disruptions to our daily activities in the Church and chapel due to heavy digging in front of Fr. Hopkins Hall. But, so far no work begun as planned. Just this week only, we finished the rain related damage to the sacristy, Fr. Hopkins Hall bathroom and the store room. Let me explain in detail.

I began planning all the renovations needed for the Parish already in 2007 when I arrived here. At that time we had only 370 children in the school. It was proposed to combine the classes and make it into one class per grade school. After we tried to work hard for the school, the enrollments in 2008 went up to 480 children. We needed new rooms to accommodate the three year olds and the two kindergarten children. We renovated one floor of the old convent and accommodated them. Lack of resources forced us to move the renovation of the top two floors to a later time. Three years ago Mayer De Blasio introduced the full day Universal Pre-K and we had to give up one of our UPKs due to lack of class rooms. The offer of one extra room in the second floor of the old convent was not acceptable then. That is when I seriously considered total renovation of the convent and extend the school fully. What was initiated in 2004 took nearly three years to get the final approval to go ahead with the plan.

Now a new scenario has emerged. This year our school student enrolment has come down to approximately 360 children. There is going to be only one Kindergarten. The school may not require this building any more. So the original purpose for which the plan was approved is reevaluated by the Archdiocese. After so many meetings and discussions, the proposal is to wait for another year with the elevator plan and just complete the interior renovation of the top two floors. This work has already begun last summer itself. Once the plumbing work is completed, the proposed fire alarm set up will begin. I hope to complete this part of the renovation by this August. I want all our parishioners to pray as the Archdiocese seriously considers re-purposing the use of the old convent so that the parish resources are not wasted but used very wisely for the benefit of all in the parish.

What is prayer all about?

Clement of Alexandria, a popular teacher of the early Church, put it simply: "Prayer is conversation with God." Like any conversation, it goes both ways. We talk to God, and He talks to us. God loves us more than we can imagine. He wants us to get to know and love Him as a Father. Like any loving parent, He wants to spend time talking with His children.

What Kind of conversation am I supposed to have?

Think of it this way: Imagine that someone saved your life through an act of great personal sacrifice. What kind of conversation would you want to have with that kind of Benefactor?

You would no doubt want to offer an earnest thank you. You would be eager to praise the person's kindness, generosity, and selflessness. You would probably ask, "How can I ever repay you?"

Now think about what God has done for us. He created us and gives us life. Every good gift we have is from Him. When the human race turned away from Him and lost its way because of sin, He made the most precious sacrifice possible to save us and bring us back to Himself: He sent His Own Son, Jesus Christ, to die for us.

What kind of conversation should you have with that kind of Benefactor? For starters, you can express to Him sincere praise and thanks.

Doesn't prayer include asking God for something?

Of course! Think of a small child who is hungry. If the child comes to Daddy asking for food, he's delighted to answer that request. And if human fathers, Jesus reminded us, know how to give good gifts to their children when asked, "how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!" (Matthew7:9-11).

In fact, most of the Our Father is devoted to this important aspect of prayer: petition. We ask God to provide for us ("our daily bread"), guide us ("lead us not into temptation"), and protect us ("deliver us from evil"). He cares about us, and He's delighted to answer our prayers. "Have no anxiety about anything," St. Paul insisted, "but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made know to God" (Philippians 4:6). Just tell God what you need.

For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and love, embracing both trial and joy.
