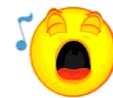
We made the Sign of the Cross before prayer which helps to fix our minds and hearts to God. After prayer, we make the Sign of the Cross to keep close to God. During trials and temptations our strength and protection is the Sign of the Cross. At Baptism, we are sealed with the Sign of the Cross, signifying the fullness of redemption and that we belong to Christ. Let us look to the cross frequently, and realize that when we make the Sign of the Cross we give our entire self to God — mind, soul, heart, body, will, thoughts.

O God, who willed that your Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known his mystery on earth, may merit the grace of his redemption in heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen

CROSS – Inspiration from Pope Francis

Christian triumph is always a cross, but a cross as a banner of victory. The resurrection is not understood without the cross. In the cross is the story of the world: grace and sin, mercy and repentance, good and evil, time and eternity.

The cross only has meaning for us who believe in eternal life. For the one who does not believe in eternal life, who believes only that life ends here and is created here, and who lives in this manner, the cross has no meaning. Such a person does not understand the cross. It is no more than decoration to wear because it is stylish, nothing more; it is not the triumph of God's salvation among us. The cross is the search for the love of God that comes out of himself in order to call us to love him: love with love.
