FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

The people of Judah practiced many abominations, even polluting God's temple in Jerusalem. They mocked the messengers he sent among them, until he grew so angry he delivered them to the King of the Chaldeans. Those who weren't killed were exiled and became servants for seventy years. Cyrus, King of Persia, was ordered to build a temple to God in Jerusalem, and he freed the servants as God had inspired him to do.

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10

Paul declares that God brought us to life in Jesus, though we had been dead from our sins. He reminds us that it was not a reward for our good service so no one should take credit. Instead, we must remember that it was not our doing, but a sign of God's mercy and love for us.

Gospel: John 3:14-21

God so loved the world, he sent us his only Son so that all who believed would have eternal life in him. The light came into the world, but those who were wicked avoided it, for fear that their evil deeds would be exposed. But those who believed were unafraid of the light, where it would be clear that their deeds were done in God.

From the Pastor's desk ...

My Dear Brothers and Sisters

I am happy to write these few lines during the Holy Season of Lent when we seriously practice the three pillars of Lent: Prayer, Penance and Almsgiving. The Sunday before Ash Wednesday I introduced the Annual Cardinal's Appeal to our parish family. On that day I explained to our parish family how all of us are united as one body of Christ. When one member is hurt all of us are hurt. That brings us to an obligation to reach out to one another. In the Church we fulfill this obligation by caring for the local church, our parish family through our weekly offerings, caring for the particular Church, the Archdiocese of New York through our offering to the Cardinal's Annual Appeal and the universal Church through our monthly offering in second collection. Some of you may wonder where all this money goes. I will explain briefly.

Our parish is 96 years old. The buildings are huge and old. The maintenance and the bills that need to be paid are too big. Sometimes I wonder how I am going to balance the maintenance of the Church, School and pay salaries for the essential services that people expect to gain from the Church and the School. I pray a lot regarding these things and somehow God inspires all of you to generously support every effort I take. We still have our convent renovation to be completed. If I am struggling with one parish in this way, imagine the struggle of our Cardinal who has the care of the entire Archdiocese, all the parishes, schools and all the various ministries. That is why Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal is essential to care for the entire diocese.
