TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9a

Isaiah describes the willingness of the Suffering Servant to submit to the persecution of his enemies. This willingness stems from true faith in God, and the knowledge that the Lord will always be his help.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

James states that if some one is hungry and you wish them well but do not help them, you have done them no good. He compares this to stating your faith, without backing it up with your actions. He reminds us that we must show our faith through our good works.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35

Jesus taught his disciples that as the Messiah, he had to suffer much, be put to death, and rise three days later. Peter began to disagree and Jesus reprimanded him for judging by human standards rather than by God's. he told them that whoever would be willing to lose their life for the sake of Jesus and the Gospel, will in fact preserve their life forever.

It will be a church of loyalty and love,

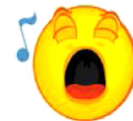

Follow in the footsteps of Jesus – Experience the Scriptures come alive as you visit the homeland of Jesus!

Father Dominic is in the process of organizing a spiritual renewal pilgrimage to the Holy Land. This is a tour and spiritual journey complete with daily Mass and spiritual instruction. This tour is tentatively scheduled from November --- to December ---,---

Tour guide Fr. Paul, a Biblical Scholar at the Studium Biblicum Franciscanum (Faculty of Biblical Sciences and Archaeology) in Jerusalem will serve as our *personal* tour guide. Fr. Paul has recently conducted bible study classes here at OLQP. A few of the places we will visit are Bethlehem, Cana, Nazareth, Tiberius, Jerusalem, Bethany (Lazarus' tomb), Masada and Qumran Caves (where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found) the Sea of Galilee (boat ride), and many more holy sites!

Tour size limited (small group)

On this pilgrimage, we will draw closer to Jesus of Nazareth, as we follow in His footsteps. On each day of this pilgrimage you will have time to renew and affirm your faith; to pray and reflect. The Scriptures will come alive as you visit Our Lord's homeland. You will be inspired by the natural beauty of this country, in addition to its rich historical heritage. Above the entrance to the Church of the Nativity it is written: "We are hoping that: If you enter here as a tourist, you would exit as a pilgrim. If you enter here as a pilgrim, you would exit as a holier one."
