Dear friends in the Lord:

This weekend, our archdiocese will collect an offering for *Aid to the Church in Central and Eastern Europe*. From 1922 to 1991 the Ukrainian people lived under a repressive communist government that restricted both religious and cultural practice. In that time, Ukrainians faced multiple wars that left a suffering people in their wake. Still today, Ukraine is rebuilding from this difficult past.

Eastern Ukraine especially suffered for many years as a stronghold of communism. The Catholic faith was illegal or restricted, so atheism grew stronger and family values deteriorated. Today, the Church is working to rebuild these values.

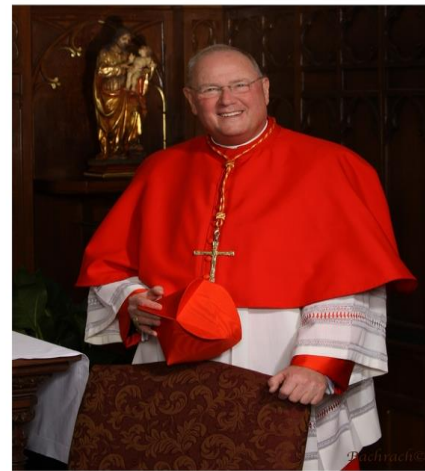

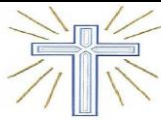
