**THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST**

**First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20**

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

**Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26**

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

**Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17**

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

## From the Pastor's Desk ...

The Feast of Corpus Christi is three feasts in one: The feast of the Eucharistic sacrifice, The feast of the Sacrament of the Eucharist and The feast of the Real Presence of Jesus in this Sacrament.

Corpus Christi is a doctrinal feast established for three purposes:

- 1) To give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to honor Him there;
- 2) To instruct the people in the Mystery, Faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist, and
- 3) To teach us to appreciate and make use of the great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as a Sacrament and as a sacrifice.

Today's theme focuses on the priesthood of Jesus. Although we celebrate the institution of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday, the Church wants to emphasize its importance by a special feast, formerly called "*Corpus Christi*." It was Pope Urban IV who first extended the feast to the universal Church. This is one of the few feasts left in which we observe a procession and a sung "*Sequence*."

*Today, we are most honored and blessed Cardinal Dolan; the Shepherd of our Archdiocese has come to celebrate the Holy Mass and procession with us. Our praise and gratitude to the Cardinal and all who participated and helped plan this most spiritual and inspiring event for our parish family.*

I would like to thank each and everyone - our families, parish staff and leadership, and all who helped us in one way or another to make this feast a very rich spiritual experience. Our gratitude to all who participated, helped in any way: decorated, organized, volunteered, Church cleaning, and contributed monetarily to make our compound sparkle in preparation for the Cardinal's Mass. Let us thank and show our appreciation also to our neighbors for their decorations and cooperation during our procession. May God continue to bless His beloved family - our parish. Kindly pray an Our Father and Hail Mary daily for all of our parishioners and all those who visit us, that we all become Jesus blessing to each other. Mary, Our Lady Queen of Peace, pray for us.

## Feast of Corpus Christi

### *O Precious and Wonderful Banquet!*

Since it was the will of God's only-begotten Son that men should share in his divinity, he assumed our nature in order that by becoming man he might make men gods. Moreover, when he took our flesh he dedicated the whole of its substance to our salvation. He offered his body to God the Father on the altar of the cross as a sacrifice for our reconciliation. He shed his blood for our ransom and purification, so that we might be redeemed from our wretched state of bondage and cleansed from all sin. But to ensure that the memory of so great a gift would abide with us forever; he left his body as food and his blood as drink for the faithful to consume in the form of bread and wine.

O precious and wonderful banquet that brings us salvation and contains all sweetness! Could anything be of more intrinsic value? Under the old law it was the flesh of calves and goats that was offered, but here Christ himself, the true God, is set before us as our food. What could be more wonderful than this? No other sacrament has greater healing power; through it sins are purged away, virtues are increased, and the soul is enriched with an abundance of every spiritual gift. It is offered in the Church for the living and the dead, so that what was instituted for the salvation of all may be for the benefit of all. Yet, in the end, no one can fully express the sweetness of this sacrament, in which spiritual delight is tasted at its very source, and in which we renew the memory of that surpassing love for us which Christ revealed in his passion.

It was to impress the vastness of this love more firmly upon the hearts of the faithful that our Lord instituted this sacrament at the Last Supper. As he was on the point of leaving the world to go to the Father, after celebrating the Passover with his disciples, he left it as a perpetual memorial of his passion. It was the fulfilment of ancient figures and the greatest of all his miracles, while for those who were to experience the sorrow of his departure, it was destined to be a unique and abiding consolation.
