Phase 1 Capital Campaign

I am pleased to announce that our Phase 1 Capital Campaign will begin in August. This five year process of preparation, planning and proposal culminated this week with Diocesan approval. Our Parish Finance Council met on Monday night, which was providential as the approval happened on Monday. We are very excited to get this project underway. It is going to be a two part process, meaning we will use the Gale Road and Burpee Road entrances at different times. Phase 1 includes the moving of the current Gale Road entrance to the North of the marquee, which will allow greater visibility for turning into the Parish from the South. You have probably noticed the bike path is progressing and will go across our entire Gale Road property. The foresight has paid off as all these projects coincide.

I am grateful to all for your prayer and pledge to make Phase 1 a reality. The recent plea for accelerated payments on pledges secured the loan necessary to begin in August. Equally, thank you to those that made additional pledges that raised our goal. The Capital Campaign has benefited as well from donations given in memorial of beloved deceased. We have received gifts from individuals outside the Parish. All these combined gifts make a difference.

I am mindful of all the work the Finance Council Buildings and Grounds Committee has previously accomplished on various capital improvements. These endeavors indicated our Parish's financial viability. It is because of these efforts that we are able to gather in such a welcoming and beautiful environment. The genius of Jim Rabine has been a gift. His experience, education and expertise were the catalyst from the beginning to where we are now in this process. A great deal of thanks goes to Jim and Carolyn Rabine for their patience and persistence for the welfare of our Parish community.

I am hopeful that an Eagle Scout project by Matt BLANK will allow for a Labyrinth to be constructed. This Labyrinth will allow for peaceful meditation for parishioners as well as those using the bike path. The proposed site will be where the old farmhouse on Gale Road used to be between the current driveway and Atlas Township. There will be information defining the history of a Labyrinth and the ways of meditation. The discussion for a Labyrinth began about six years ago. I am excited to have this as part of the beautification of our Catholic grounds.

I am asking for your prayers during these months when all of these improvements are underway. It will be good to see each improvement come to fruition!
