Psalms 104 "O bless the Lord, my soul."

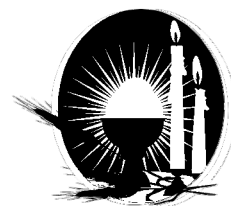
Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7 We are saved through the bath of rebirth.

Today's readings are a mini-excursion through Advent and Christmas, depositing us on the threshold of Ordinary Time. The reading from Isaiah recalls the Advent message of comfort and hope. Saint Paul proclaims that the grace of God has appeared. In the Gospel we have an adult Jesus being baptized by John, ready for his mission and affirmed by the voice of God. As we listen to these words of Scripture, let us recall our own Baptism and prepare for whatever God will ask us to do next.

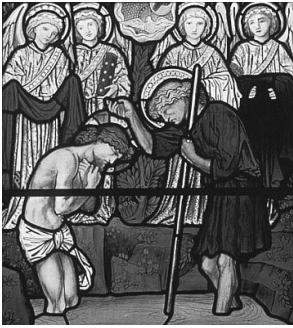
Everyone loved the gifts (especially the shut-ins) and were amazed that people really cared. It was an example of Christ's teaching - "Love one another."

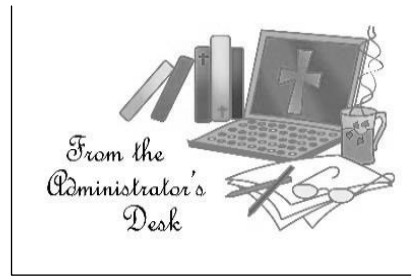

And behold a voice from heaven, saying: This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

Beloved of God,

Meditations on the Baptism of Our Blessed Lord



“After all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized and was praying,

heaven was opened and the holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, “You are My beloved Son; with You I am well pleased.” (Luke 3:21-22)

Prayer and Meditation on the Holy Scriptures is so very important in the development of our spiritual lives. In a conversation with a priest friend, he related how for the first time in his twenty-five years he had noticed something remarkable about the star in the Infancy Narrative. (You might want to check it out yourself.) This reading and re-reading and prayerfully meditating upon the Divinely Inspired Word of God can constantly teach us about the Almighty and ever deepen our relationship with and love of God....

So why did Jesus get baptized? Did He need it? Remember baptism is necessary to wash away Original Sin. So, Jesus did not need to get baptized because He had no sin, Original or otherwise. So why did He get baptized? To teach as He said in another place... *“Whoever serves Me must follow Me, and where I am, there also will My servant be.” (John 12:26)* In other words, do as I do. But, again, why?

At Holy Mass, it is a joy after the Consecration of the bread and wine to become the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Blessed Lord, as a community of faith we all stand and praise the Almighty in the prayer taught us by His Beloved Son... *The Our Father.*

So again, why did Jesus submit to be baptized? So that the first word of this divine prayer would be true... *“Our.”* As we have come to know, the birth of Our Blessed Lord, not only consecrated human existence from conception to death, but also unified us to God as Jesus’ Humanity was one with His Divinity in the person of Our Savior. The only dividing mark still between us was what cast us from the Garden of Eden... Sin. Through Jesus’ baptism He consecrated, He made holy, the flowing waters of the river Jordan and transformed them into a cleansing sacrament washing away Original Sin. We then have the opportunity to fulfill the priestly prayer of Jesus at the Last Supper... *“I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word, so that they may all be one, as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me.” (John 17:20-21)* The *Our* of this glorious prayer, *the Our Father*, is an invitation by God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit to be one with Them. How could we refuse? Let us pray the prayer daily for our personal unity with the Divine and for each other that we may be one as They are One.
