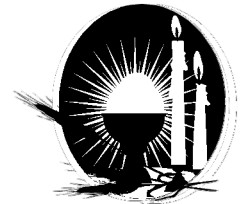
FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jeremiah 1:4-5. 17-19 The word of the Lord comes to Jeremiah.
Psalm 71 "I will sing of your salvation."
1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13 or 13:4-13 The greatest of these is love.
Luke 4:21-30 The people rise up to drive Jesus out of their town.

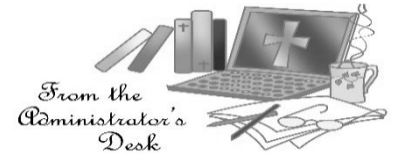

Cardinal's Appeal Prayer

God our Father, source of all blessings, we call upon You with faith, for You have shown Your love for us in so many ways. Now we ask You to inspire Your people to make a very generous donation to our Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal. Presentation of Our Lord: Tuesday, February 2, we celebrate Feast of the Purification of the Virgin, or Candlemas Day. Counting forward from December 25 as Day One, we find that Day Forty is February 2. A Jewish woman is in semi-seclusion for 40 days after giving birth to a son, and accordingly it is on February 2 that we celebrate the coming of Mary and Joseph with the infant Jesus to the Temple at Jerusalem to offer sacrifice, both on behalf of Mary and on behalf of Jesus as a first-born male. ***Almighty and ever living God, we humbly pray that, as your Only-begotten Son was this day presented in the temple, so we may be presented to you with pure and clean hearts by Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.***

Feast of St. Blaise, February 3: St. Blaise was a physician and the Bishop of Sebaste, Armenia. He once saved a child who was choking on a fish bone, which led to the blessing of the throats.

O, glorious St. Blaise, who by your martyrdom left to the Church a precious witness to the faith, obtain for us the grace to preserve within ourselves this divine gift, and to defend without concern for human respect both by word and example, the truth of the same faith, which is so wickedly attacked and slandered in these our times. You miraculously restored a little child who was at the point of death because of an affliction of the throat. Grant us your mighty protection in similar misfortunes. The Power of Prayer

“The Lord replied, ‘If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to (this) mulberry tree, ‘Be uprooted and planted in the sea,’ and it would obey you.’” (Luke 17:6)



“Whatever you ask for in prayer with faith, you will receive.” (Matthew 21:22)

We are daily faced with numerous challenges which most of the time we are able to seemingly handle on our own. There are those other moments when we necessarily turn to others for help, support, and consolation. As our family, friends and others gather around us we genuinely feel them propping us up with love, compassion, and empathy. *“Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hand, Amalek prevailed. But Moses’ hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the sun set. And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword.”* (Exodus 17:11-13) In both of these moments, supposedly alone & in the fraternity of loved ones, there may be One that we often forget about Who is ever-present... *“Then Jesus approached and said to them... ‘And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.’”* (Matthew 28:18a/28:20b) Especially in these situations of distress, Our Blessed Lord is with us... *“I have prayed that your own faith may not fail; and once you have turned back, you must strengthen your brothers.”* (Luke 22:32) How remarkable to comprehend, how consoling to the struggling soul, *Jesus is praying for us.* We often think ourselves alone and wonder where God is. Our Brother, the Christ, has told us that He is praying for us. Jesus, can only be doing this if He first knows what is going on in our lives... *“Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words...”* (Romans 8:26) while at the same time loves us so deeply to pray that our *“own faith may not fail...”* our faith individually, as the one going through the trial, and as a whole, that we must be there to *“strengthen”* our brothers and sisters. This presence of the Almighty fills us with the grace to be able to pray for ourselves and others. The grace of God being with us gives us the ability to know that *“Whatever you (we) ask for in prayer with faith, you (we) will receive.”* We must, though, ask for the intention with true faith. Faith in God as God. Faith in God as being able to achieve all things for us. Faith in God that what is best for us – the salvation of our souls – is what God will do. Faith that if that which we want goes against the will of the Almighty, we will trust that God loves us, knows what is best for us, and that God will always be there for us. Even though we may have a *“little faith”* (Matthew 17:20), Jesus tells us *“do not be afraid.”* (Mark 5:36) Fear undermines our belief, fear clouds our vision of the Almighty, fear freezes us, fear disconnects us from God. *“Do not be afraid; just have faith.”*



In the words of Our Savior, Jesus the Christ: *“Whatever you ask for in prayer with faith, you will receive.”* (Matthew 21:22) *“Therefore I tell you, all that you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it and it shall be yours.”* (Mark 11:24)
