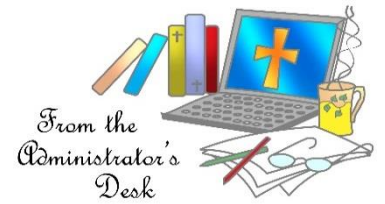

Dear Parishioners:

- The Cardinal's Appeal: The Cardinal Appeal is progressing. The goal for our parish is \$95,500.00. To date our parish has received \$56,526.00 in pledges and gifts towards the 2016 Cardinal's Appeal from 211 families. We are \$39,974.00 from goal. We need your help we have over 1100 families registered to our parish and we have received from only 20 percent of them. If the remaining families donated \$50.00 each we would be over goal. Please consider a gift to the appeal on behalf of your parish. Your generosity is greatly appreciated, and as always, thank you!
- Confirmation: Our confirmation candidates will be receiving the *Sacrament of Confirmation* today, Sunday, April 17th at 3:00 PM. *Bishop Gerald T. Walsh* will be officiating. Please join us in praying for our Confirmandi, their parents and sponsors. A special thank you to our Pastor, Fr. Fernan, our priests, our school Principal, Mrs. Lauren Lewis, Mrs. Anne Mulvey, our Religion Teacher in Saint Eugene School as well as Mr. John Fuoco and Mrs. Nora Russo, our Religious Education teachers. A big thank you to our sixth grade religious education class who assisted us in setting up the church for Confirmation. Congratulations to all!
- Spring Cleaning: With the winter weather behind us we are looking forward to spring and repairing the very long list of items that need to be tended to. The inside lights in the rear of the church have been repaired as well as all of the switches in the sacristy which needed to be replaced. Our electrician is also installing LED (energy efficient) solar sensitive light fixtures to all the buildings on our property. Safety for our students, staff, and parishioners is at top of our list. Our gutters on the school/church building have been cleaned and repaired as well as the convent/church office. This past Tuesday an engineer from Titan Mechanical was on site on the church roof inspecting all of our air conditioner units, we have 10, and only 6 are in working condition. The pans on 8 of the units are completely rusted and that is why water enters the church through the ceiling. Once we receive their proposal we will be discussing the repair or removal of the units and new energy efficient units. Once the work is done then we can repair the inside ceiling. Also on Tuesday we had three roofing companies looking at the flat tar roof on the church/school which needs to be replaced. The last time the roof was replaced was at least 20 years ago. We have hired a new landscaper who will be cleaning up all the dead branches and shrubs which line our property as well as maintain our plants on a monthly basis.

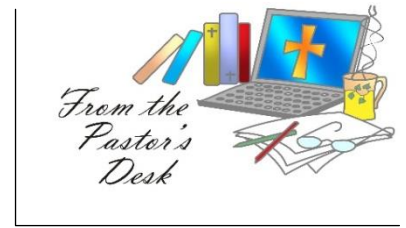

Beloved of God,

“The Rubrics of bowing and genuflecting during the Holy Mass.”

“What has happened?” vs. “What is happening?” So let us go back to the questions raised last week... “So then, since Jesus is present in the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the Tabernacle, why don’t we genuflect or at least bow every time we pass before the Tabernacle? “What is actually happening during the Holy Mass?” “Is the Holy Mass just a reenactment of the Original Last Supper as many Christian Faiths believe?” “Is the Holy Mass just a symbolic representation of Christ’s sacrifice on the Holy Cross?”



The Catechism of the Catholic Church writes with reference to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass...

*“1366 The Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (**makes present**) the sacrifice of the cross, because it is its memorial and because it applies its fruit: [Christ], our Lord and God, was once and for all to offer Himself to God the Father by His death on the altar of the cross, to accomplish there an everlasting redemption. But because His priesthood was not to end with His death, at the Last Supper “on the night when He was betrayed,” [He wanted] to leave to His beloved spouse the Church a visible sacrifice (as the nature of man demands) by which the bloody sacrifice which He was to accomplish once for all on the cross would be re-presented, its memory perpetuated until the end of the world, and its salutary power be applied to the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit. 189”*

“1367 The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: “The victim is one and the same: the same now offers through the ministry of priests, who then offered Himself on the cross; only the manner of offering is different.” “And since in this divine sacrifice which is celebrated in the Mass, the same Christ who offered Himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross is contained and offered in an unbloody manner . . . this sacrifice is truly propitiatory.”

“What has happened?” In the Tabernacle, there is the Real Presence of Christ... Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity. At a Holy Mass previously offered, the miracle of Transubstantiation changed the bread and wine and His Body and Blood. That is what has happened before. So the Real Presence is really present in the tabernacle.

“What is happening?” In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass you are attending, or that is happening continuously all over the world, the “one single sacrifice” is really occurring. *“The victim is one and the same... only the manner of offering is different.”* So the actions of the Last Supper are actually unfolding before us. At the Holy Mass we become participants in the Last Supper of Christ on the one and only Holy Thursday. If this was a movie scene, we are being transported into that moment which took place 2000 years ago and still takes place now. So why is our concentration supposed to be at the altar during the Holy Mass? Precisely because each Holy Mass is the one and only Holy Mass offered by Jesus on Holy Thursday. Before the Holy Mass begins we give proper recognition to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle, but during the Holy Mass all our attention must be at the Holy Altar where the Holy Thursday Sacrifice at the Last Supper is being revealed.
