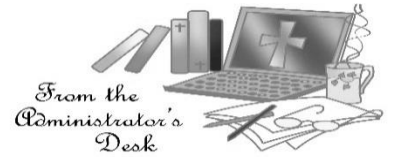
Dear Parishioners:

The Cardinal's Appeal: The Cardinal Appeal is progressing. The goal for our parish is \$95,500.00. To date our parish has received \$84,981.00 in pledges and gifts towards the 2016 Cardinal's Appeal from 274 families. Please consider a gift to the appeal on behalf of your parish. Your generosity is greatly appreciated, and as always, thank you!

Saint Eugene Church: Last October I explained to you, our parishioners, the need of placing blue tarps on all of our air conditioners, because of rotting of the pans, and the leaking of rainwater into our church. On April 13, engineers from **Titan Mechanical** did a full evaluation of our 10 air conditioners and life expectancy. At that time, we were informed that out of the ten units, three were completely rusted and beyond repair. The remaining seven units are rusted and starting to pitch toward the unit wall due to cabinet deterioration. The unit's performance; Seasonal Energy Efficiency Rating is poor and the blower motor readings are higher than specified, indicating motor wear and tear. Three of the units have pulley vibration which indicates that the blower bearings are damaged. The refrigerant charge (R-22), in all seven units was low and needs to be charged before using. At that time we were given two options: **Option #1** - Remove and replace all of the 10 units, disconnect existing electrical, evacuate remaining refrigerant as per code 608 and the EPA Clean Air Act, procure licensed crane and operator for removal, and rigging of new equipment, supply and install 10 new units, reconnect existing power and control wiring, and add a thermostat for the units so that it does not run all day, and turns off when it reaches the said temperature. The cost of this is \$84,060.00; this does not include permits, certified engineering drawings, design and seismic engineering fees. **Option #2** - Remove all doors and access point on remaining seven units, seal/coat all base rail internal joints, cracks and seams with spray epoxy, clean and pressure wash all coils, replace all the filters, clean all drain pans and traps, seal all drains with epoxy, clean and pressure wash compressor compartment, adjust motor pulleys and grease, check for refrigeration leaks at all fittings and coils, charge the remaining seven units with R-22 refrigerant. The cost of this is \$7500.00. On May 3rd and 11th we proceeded with Option#2. The engineers from Titan Mechanical also installed double PVC traps and extensions. The thermostat is on order and will be installed within the next few weeks. By us proceeding with Option #2 we have insured that we have air conditioning for the summer months, while we discuss options on replacing the units and raising the necessary funds.

Beloved of God,

Solemnity of Corpus Christi – The Body and Blood of Jesus Our Blessed Lady and the Holy Mass



“When the hour came, Jesus took His place at the table, and the apostles with Him. He said to them, “I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; for I tell you, I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.” Then He took a cup, and after giving thanks He said, “Take this and divide it among yourselves; for I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.” Then He took a loaf of bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.” And He did the same with the cup after supper, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood.” (Luke 22:14-20)

“Jesus took His place at the table, and the apostles with Him.” Where is Mary? Our Blessed Lady, Our Holy Mother was not present at the Last Supper. One would think that at this most important moment, when Her Son was reconfiguring the Holy Covenants of Old made between God and His Chosen People, that the Mother of God, the woman Who made all this possible, would be there. But She wasn't. Our Holy Mother, Mary was conspicuously absent. Or was She?

During Holy Week, we are given by the Holy Church the *Paschal Triduum* which reveals the Paschal Mystery – *“Christ’s work of redemption accomplished principally by His Passion, death, Resurrection and Glorious Ascension, whereby “dying He destroyed our death, rising He restored our life.”* (Catechism of the Catholic Church, pg. 891) This Mystery is revealed over time, most especially during the three days, Triduum, from Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday. The Holy Mass is the beginning of the revelation of the Suffering and Death of Our Savior. *“When the hour came”* is a prediction by Christ of His Passion. The Holy Mass is that unbloody Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. Although, we do not see Our Blessed Lady at the First Mass where Jesus consecrated His first Bishops, She is ever present at the actual scene of the Crucifixion. Jesus’ Mother never left His side. Even though the other Apostles would abandon Him and betray Him (Luke 22:39-62), Our Blessed Lady, His first Disciple, remained ever vigilant, *“Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were His mother, and His mother’s sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene.”* (John 19:25), as the Holy Mass unfolded. Let us remember that when we receive Holy Communion, we receive the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. We mysteriously receive the Body of His Passion, His Crucified Body, His Risen Body and His Divinity. As the entire event of Christ’s Passion, Death and Resurrection are present in the Blessed Sacrament so are those three days, the Paschal Triduum, captured in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament as well. So even though, Our Blessed Lady was not present at the Last Supper, She is a part of the Paschal Triduum as She is ever-present at the Crucifixion.

Some saints, who have been graced with a special vision of the Holy Mass, offer that just as Our Blessed Lady was present before the foot of the Cross as Her Son was offered to the Father on the altar of the Cross, so is She ever-present during every Holy Mass. Our Blessed Lady, who has never received Holy Communion, but who was the original Tabernacle of the soon-to-be-born Savior of the World, is always by Her Son’s side.

Mary our Mother, please lead us to the Cross of your Son especially through the Holy Mass. God love you... Father Fernan
