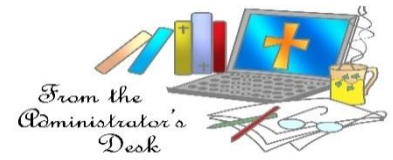

CONGRATULATIONS

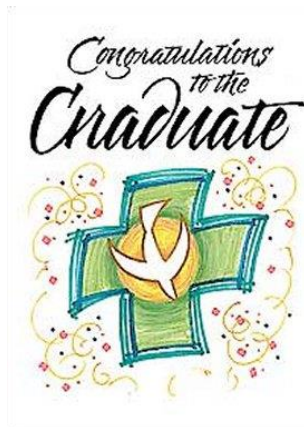

GRADUATION

“The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw Him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, “All power in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:16-20)



Graduation Day. That was the Eleven Disciples Graduation Day. They had spent three years of intensive learning with the Savior. Day after day, the Christ would be teaching all His followers... *“When He saw the crowds, He went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him. He began to teach them, saying: “Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land...”* (Matthew 5:1-5). And then as the day would come to a close, Jesus would have private lessons with the 12... *“All these things Jesus spoke to the crowds*

in parables. He spoke to them only in parables, to fulfill what had been said through the prophet: “I will open my mouth in parables, I will announce what has lain hidden from the foundation of the world.” Then, dismissing the crowds, He went into the house. His disciples approached Him and said, “Explain to us the parable of the weeds in the field: He said in reply...” (Matthew 13:34-37a). Our Blessed Savior not only taught in the usual ways, but He also taught in the most extraordinary manners as well... *“So, during supper, fully aware that the Father had put everything into His power and that He had come from God and was returning to God, Jesus rose from supper and took off His outer garments. He took a towel and tied it around His waist. Then He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples’ feet and dry them with the towel around His waist...,”* (John 13:2b-5) and *“When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified Him and the criminals there, one on His right, the other on His left. Then Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, they know not what they do.”* (Luke 23:33-34)

After all these lessons and the *“many other things that Jesus did (and taught)”* the Apostles were finally prepared most especially through the Gift of the Holy Spirit (as in Confirmation) that descended upon them at Pentecost... *“When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, (the Apostles) were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim...”* (Acts of the Apostles 2:1-3), the Eleven were ready. And so on the Feast of the Ascension, Jesus returned to heaven, The Apostles graduated. They were entrusted with the mission of continuing the word of the Savior. As you graduate, you too are commissioned to participate in the work of the Apostles. So, *“go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”*
