Dear Parishioners:



- *His Eminence Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan*: Delight yourself also in the LORD: and he shall give you the desires of your heart. *Psalms 37:4*  
WOW... What a Sunday morning in the parish of Saint Eugene. There are many things that you can plan... weather is not one of them... so on a slippery and icy Sunday we were blessed with the Mass celebrated by his **Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan**, as well as our own **Father Fernan, Father Anthony, and Deacon Duffy**. The church was filled and so were all of our hearts as we praised God and prayed together as one family as we do every week. "For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made with human hands that were only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence". *Hebrews 9:24*.
- *Renew & Rebuild*: Last weekend we formally announced the *Renew & Rebuild Campaign* in our Parish. All parishes in the Archdiocese will be participating in this Campaign. We are in Phase One of the Campaign along with 50 other parishes. Renew and Rebuild is a \$200 million initiative for the parishes of the Archdiocese of New York. Our Parish goal is 1,200,000.00. As of today we have \$550,000.00 in pledges. Please pray and join us in the very important parish initiative. We will have a meeting on Thursday, March 2 at 7:00 in the church to explain the campaign and the needs of our church.
- *President's Day*: The church office will be closed on Monday, February 20<sup>th</sup> in observance of President's Day. The office will reopen on Tuesday, February 21<sup>st</sup> at 9:30 am.
- *Altar Server Practice*: The next Altar Server Practice will be held on Thursday, March 2<sup>nd</sup> at 4:00 in the church.
- *Feast Day Celebrations*: Please join us on Sunday, March 12, for our annual Saint Patrick and Saint Joseph celebrations. - *Religious Education*: There is no class next Wednesday, February 22 in observance of the public schools mid-winter recess.
- *Religious Education / Inclement Weather*: Just a reminder, if there is any form of winter precipitation that should occur on Wednesday afternoons or evenings, which may interfere with Religious Education, or safety on the roads, please watch news 12 for cancellations.
- *Feast of the Chair of Saint Peter, February 22*: The Feast of the Chair of St. Peter celebrates the papacy and St.



Peter as the first bishop of Rome. St. Peter's original name was Simon. He was married with children and was living and working in Capernaum as a fisherman when Jesus called him to be one of the Twelve Apostles. Jesus bestowed to Peter a special place among the Apostles. He was one of the three who were with Christ on special occasions, such as the Transfiguration of Christ and the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. He was the only Apostle to whom Christ appeared on the first day after the Resurrection. Peter, in turn, often spoke on behalf of the Apostles. When Jesus asked the Apostles: "Whom do men say that the Son of Man is?" Simon replied: "Thou art Christ, the Son of the Living God." And Jesus said: "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jona: because flesh and blood have not revealed it to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I say to you: That you are Peter (Cephas, a rock), and upon this rock (Cephas) I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. And I will give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. And whatsoever you shall bind upon earth, it shall be bound also in

heaven: and whatsoever you shall loose on earth, it shall be loosed also in heaven". (Mt 16:13-20) In saying this Jesus made St. Peter the head of the entire community of believers and placed the spiritual guidance of the faithful in St. Peter's hands. However, St. Peter was not without faults. He was rash and reproached often by Christ. He had fallen asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane instead of praying, as Jesus had asked him to do. He also denied knowing Jesus three times after Christ's arrest. Peter delivered the first public sermon after the Pentecost and won a large number of converts. He also performed many miracles and defended the freedom of the Apostles to preach the Gospels. He preached in Jerusalem, Judaea, and as far north as Syria. He was arrested in Jerusalem under Herod Agrippa I, but miraculously escaped execution. He left Jerusalem and eventually went to Rome, where he preached during the last portion of his life. He was crucified there, head downwards, as he had desired to suffer, saying that he did not deserve to die as Christ had died. The date of St. Peter's death is not clear. Historians estimate he was executed between the years 64 and 68. His remains now rest beneath the altar of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

## Pastoral Visit of Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan February 12, 2017



The morning began with Ms. Mastrangelo and I welcoming a number of parishioners to the Parish Offices (formerly the convent of the Sisters of Saint Francis of Saint John Neumann) for a gathering with His Eminence, Cardinal Dolan. Those present had either already made donations to the Archdiocesan Renew & Rebuild Campaign for our parish or were being asked to prayerfully consider a pledge. Our parish goal is \$1,200,000. With the donations already made, we have more than 45% already pledged. Thanks goes out to those parishioners who have already made donations. At the gathering, His Eminence was as he seemed at the Holy Mass to follow in the church. So welcoming, so warm, so wanting to let all those know of his love for them and for the parish of Saint Eugene.

After the reception, the Cardinal walked to the church, if you recall in that “lovely” weather. To get him inside as soon as possible, we entered through the long hallway school door. In our preparations, the Boy Scouts had been notified of His Eminence’s visit. In the picture to the right I am holding the special treats that were prepared for the Cardinal. They were magnificently decorated with His Eminence’s Coat of Arms and other symbols. As we walked the church, Cardinal Dolan told me of his first assignment to a church in Saint Louis which was also in the round, so he was immediately at ease as he recalled fondly his first assignment as a holy priest of Jesus Christ.



What a gift was the Holy Mass. What a gift were those of the Children’s Choir who had extra practices in preparation for this wonderful event. What a gift were the Altar Servers – both boys and girls – who were so excited and proud to assisting His Eminence. And what a gift was Cardinal Dolan who did rush through the many meetings which became personal interactions with the parishioners and visitors. From the Seniors to the Servers and all those in between, Cardinal Dolan spoke with them, posed for pictures for them, just after he had offered the Holy Mass for them. He came as the Cardinal Archbishop of New York, and he left as our father/pastor. On behalf of all the

parishioners, the Cardinal was given an Olive Wood statue of Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary, the Foster-Father of Jesus and the Patron of the Universal Church. His Eminence immediately kissed and revered the statue.

What a glorious day! What a gift of the Spiritual! Let us spiritually Renew & Rebuild our parish together.
