THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Exodus 17:3-7 Water flowed from rock to quench the people thirst.
Psalm 95 "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts."
Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 God's love is poured into our hearts in the Gifts of the Spirit."
John 4:5-42 or 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42 The water Jesus gives is the wellspring of eternal life.

Water is the primary symbol in the sacrament of Baptism, and we have it in abundance in today's readings: Moses and the people in the desert longing for water, Saint Paul describing the love of God that "has been poured out into our hearts," and the story of Jesus and the woman at the well. Listening to these inspired Scriptures today, let us contemplate what the waters of our own Baptism means to us.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY

This is the recipe given to us by the Saint Vincent DePaul Society of Saint Eugene Parish. It is important that all of the chicken baked and donated is the same.

The recipe for the chicken legs and thighs is as follows: Wash and clean chicken, season, place chicken in large tray, add ½ cup water. Bake at 375 degrees skin side down for 45 minutes, turn chicken over, season and bake skin side up for an additional 45 minutes. When the chicken is done sprinkle with paprika.

Please drain all juices and transport the chicken in Ziploc bags.


Dear Parishioners;




Beloved of God,

Eucharist Heart of Jesus Litany – Part 5C

“Heart of Jesus in the Eucharist, sweet companion of our exile, I adore You.”

“And Jesus said, “Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died: this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is My flesh for the life of the world.”” (John 6:48-52)



Jesus' new teaching in the *Bread of Life Discourse* is beginning to open the minds of the Holy People of God to the Eucharist... the Bread of Life... not just manna, “a food that perishes,” but seeking “the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you.” (John 6:27) From five barley loaves and two fish, Jesus feed the more than 5000 people who were following Him at the time. (John 6:9-13) Christ kept revealing Himself more and more as the King He was and is, but the people still did not understand... “When the people saw the sign He had done, they said, “This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world.” Since Jesus knew that they were going to come and carry Him off to make Him king, He withdrew again to the mountain alone.” (John 6:14-15) The Jewish people were under the rule of the Romans. They were looking for anyone to step forward to lead them out from under their control. When trying to understand the Kingship of Jesus, we must remember the conversation between Pontius Pilate and Our Blessed Lord on that first Good Friday...

“So Pilate went back into the praetorium and summoned Jesus and said to Him, “Are You the King of the Jews?” Jesus answered, “Do you say this on your own or have others told you about Me?” Pilate answered, “I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests handed You over to me. What have You done?” Jesus answered, “My kingdom does not belong to this world. If My kingdom did belong to this world, My attendants would be fighting to keep Me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, My kingdom is not here.” Pilate said to Him, “Then You are a king?” Jesus answered, “You say I am a king.” (John 18:33-37)

“My kingdom does not belong to this world.” Those followers of Jesus, after He had fed the more than 5000 people, were ready to take a chance on Him. If He could feed all of us, what else could He do? So, they wanted to “come and carry Him off to make Him king.” Jesus had to prevent this so He withdrew to the solace of private prayer, and went “again to the mountain alone.”

But because He had fed all those people, and because it was evening, all of them did not return to their homes. Many stayed and looked for Jesus the next day... “When the crowd saw that neither Jesus nor His disciples were there, they themselves got into boats and came to Capernaum looking for Jesus.” (John 6:22) It must have been so impressive to see those scores of people and boats following after one Man. But our Blessed Lord reacted to them most accurately when He said, “Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for Me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.” (John 6:22) Jesus knew well these souls. He knew that they did not only hunger for Spiritual Food but they really hungered for actual food. So the *Miracle of the Feeding the 5000* was the setup or introduction to the *Bread of Life Discourse*. So Jesus continued, “Do not work for food that perishes but for food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on Him the Father, God, has set His seal.” (John 6:27)
