Dear Parishioners:

The Most Holy Trinity, June 11: The fundamental dogma, on which everything in Christianity is based, is that of the Blessed Trinity in whose name all Christians are baptized. The feast of the Blessed Trinity needs to be understood and celebrated as a prolongation of the mysteries of Christ and as the solemn expression of our faith in this triune life of the Divine Persons, to which we have been given access by Baptism and by the Redemption won for us by Christ. Only in Heaven shall we properly understand what it means, in union with Christ, to share as sons in the very life of God. The feast of the Blessed Trinity was introduced in the ninth century and was only inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the fourteenth century by Pope John XXII. But the fact of the Trinity is, of course, to be found throughout the liturgy. Constantly the Church causes us to praise and adore the thrice-holy God who has so shown His mercy towards us and has given us to share in His life. The dogma of faith which forms the object of the feast is this: There is one God and in this one God there are three Divine Persons; the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. Yet there are not three Gods, but one, eternal, incomprehensible God. The Father is not more God than the Son, neither is the Son more God than the Holy Spirit. The Father is the first Divine Person; the Son is the second Divine Person, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; the Holy Spirit is the third Divine Person, proceeding from the Father and the Son. No mortal can fully fathom this sublime truth. Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all sacred functions. After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, and our Consoler. On solemn occasions a thanksgiving *Te Deum* (*God we praise you*) rises spontaneously from Christian hearts. The feast of the Most Holy Trinity may well be regarded as the Church's *Te Deum* of gratitude over all the blessings of the Christmas and Easter seasons; for this mystery is a synthesis of Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost. This feast, which falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity, that every Sunday is sanctified and consecrated to the triune God. Sunday after Sunday we should recall in a spirit of gratitude the gifts which the Blessed Trinity is bestowing upon us. The Father created and predestined us; on the first day of the week He began the work of creation. The Son redeemed us; Sunday is the "Day of the Lord," the day of His resurrection. The Holy Spirit sanctified us, made us His temple; on Sunday the Holy Spirit descended upon the infant Church. Sunday, therefore, is *the* day of the Most Holy Trinity. *Symbols of the Trinity:* Equilateral Triangle; Circle of Eternity; Three interwoven Circles; Triangle in Circle; Circle within Triangle; Interwoven Circle and Triangle; Two Triangles interwoven in shape of Star of David; Two Triangles in shape of Star of David interwoven with Circle; Trefoil; Trefoil and Triangle; Trefoil with points; Triquetra; Triquetra and circle; Shield of the Holy Trinity; Three Fishes linked together in shape of a triangle; Cross and Triangle overlapping; Fleur de Lys; St. Patrick's Shamrock. *Excerpts from the USCCB.*

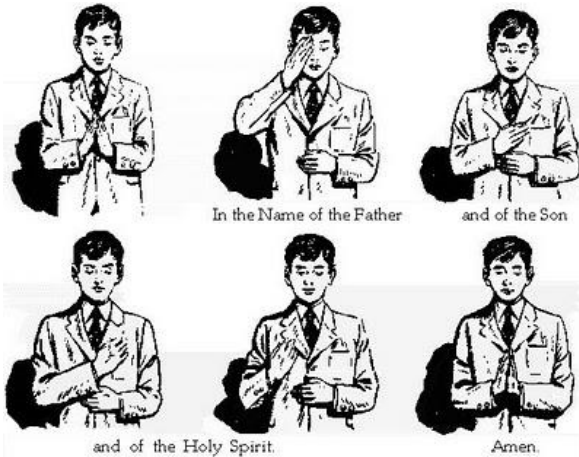

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



"The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they saw Him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:16-20)

I like sitting in the front seats of the hearse. Let me be more accurate... I prefer to sit in the front seats of the hearse. Not

just because of the obvious... there is room for only one in the back. But because of what I am able to observe as the cortege proceeds to the cemetery.

- There are some drivers who cut into the line of mourners cars.
- There are some drivers who cut off the hearse.
- There are some drivers who appear visibly inconvenienced by the line of mourners' cars.
- But... then there are some drivers who will hold up traffic so that all the mourners can proceed to their loved ones' burial (these are typically truck drivers).
- And... there are those who give homage and recognition to the Blessed Trinity as the hearse is passing.

What do I mean by giving "homage and recognition to the Blessed Trinity as the hearse is passing?" They are *Signing* or *Blessing* themselves with the Sign of Our Salvation... the Sign of The Cross. And who are these people who are giving "homage and recognition to the Blessed Trinity as the hearse is passing?" You might be surprised... I was... but the people who most often make the *Sign of the Cross* are Construction Workers – those called blue collar workers. Why are they signing themselves? Maybe they are...

- Offering a quiet prayer for the soul of the one who was called home to God,
- Offering a quiet prayer for the family of the one who was called home to God,
- Offering a quiet prayer for their loved ones who they now recall as called home to God,
- Praying or saying to themselves, "There, but for the grace of God, go I."

Whatever the reason, they have decided to make a public affirmation about the reality and belief in the Most Holy Blessed Trinity – God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Sometimes while I am standing outside of our church or sitting at the shrine to Our Lady of Grace or on those crazy busy streets, there are those who while driving past also *Make the Sign of the Cross*. What are they acknowledging? That under the form of bread, the *Real Presence, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Blessed Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ* is truly present in our churches and that Jesus is present in the His Sacred Priesthood.

How often do you make the *Sign of the Cross*? How often do you think of God? How often do you pray to the Almighty? How often do you realize how much God is involved in your life?

Father, Son and Spirit... in the making of the Sign of the Cross, I acknowledge You and ask You to bless me.
