Most of the Gospel's readings during Ordinary Time this year are taken from the Gospel of Saint Mark. Mark wrote his Gospel as a dramatic story with Jesus at the center. Jesus is always moving, inviting His disciples--and us--to follow. Mark wanted those who heard or read his Gospel to come to understand Jesus and recognize Him as the Son of God. As is typical, Jesus moves quickly through a growing crowd in today's Gospel, rebuking those who misunderstand His power, warning those who blaspheme against the Holy Spirit, and redefining their understanding of family.

The Cardinal's Appeal: The Cardinal Appeal is progressing. Your gift to the Appeal helps to fund many Charities to the people in our archdiocese and throughout the world. To date our parish has received \$51,202.67 in pledges and gifts towards the 2018 Cardinal's Appeal from 205 families. Our parish has 1582 registered households with multiple families living within those homes. We have received gifts from only 155 households which is 10 percent. This appeal is extremely important to our parish and other organizations in the Archdiocese. The Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal assists our aging priests in nursing homes, works of charity, and assists our catholic schools missions and evangelization, as well as needy parishes. The goal for Saint Eugene Parish is \$96,000.00. If every household that remains gave just \$100.00 per household that would net us \$142,700.00. Every dollar that we receive over our goal is given back to the parish. Please pray about giving a gift, it can be given at once or in installments. Thank you for your consideration on this matter.

June 13th The Feast of Saint Anthony: Saint Anthony of Padua born Fernando Martins de Bulhões also known as Anthony of Lisbon, was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the

Church on 16 January 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things.

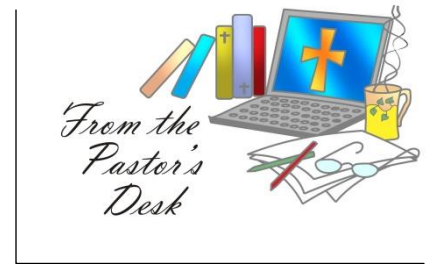

Intercede for Us

What a glorious five and a half weeks. We have been blessed to witness and receive so many awesome actions of the Almighty. We have to ask ourselves two questions... Why and What?

Why did all this happen? What made all this possible? First the why. Why did all this happen, from the Birth of Jesus to His suffering and death, to His resurrection and Ascension to Heaven? Why did God do all this? *“Jesus said, “that the world may know that You sent Me, and that You loved them even as You loved Me.”* (John 17:23b) We are being told that within the relationships of the Blessed Trinity there is love. The Father loves the Son. The Son loves the Father. The Spirit is the essence of the Love. Love is the fundamental nature of God. With the revelation of the Son in the Person of Jesus Christ we are not only learning about the nature of God as explained by Jesus in the Scriptures, but we are also learning about how we also relate to this God Whose nature is Love. In the passage above, spoken by Christ during the Last Supper, we see the Love of the Father for the Son... *“as You loved Me.”* We see the mission of the Son, *“that the world may know that You sent Me.”* We see the desire of the Son, *“that the world may know... that You loved them....”* In our human nature we attribute the epicenter of our “love” to be located in the heart. As our words always fall short of our own realities and most especially when we are attempting to explain God, let us simply say that when we are going to answer the question, “Why did all this happen?,” we must reply, *“For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life.”* (John 3:16) God loves us. God has revealed His heart to us... so we might be saved. This is the why. The Sacred Heart of Jesus living, suffering, dying and resurrected for us.

On to the What. What made all this possible? *“In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary...Then the angel said to Her, “Do not be afraid, Mary, for You have found favor with God. Behold, You will conceive in Your womb and bear a Son, and You shall name Him Jesus...Mary said, “Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to Me according to Your word.”* (Luke 1:26-27, 30-31, 38) What made all this possible? The sinless soul and devoted heart of our Blessed Lady. A heart filled with such great charity that even though She knows of the divine life within Her womb, She does not glorify Herself... *“Mary said: ‘My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; My spirit rejoices in God My Savior. For He has looked upon His handmaid's lowliness; behold, from now on will all ages call Me blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for Me, and holy is His name.’* (Luke 1:46-49) Because of Her great love, because of Her immaculate heart, the Blessed Virgin Mary, was able to say “Yes” to the Angel Gabriel in words since She had already given Her heart to God.

One prayer that is offered says, “Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Yours.” May we follow this prayer with another, “Mary, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto yours.”
