## TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

**Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-8** You shall not add to what I command you...keep the commandments of the Lord.

**Psalms 15** "The one who does justice will live in the presence of the Lord."

**James 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27** Be doers of the word.

**Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23** You disregard God's commandments but cling to human tradition.

Jesus has some harsh words today for those who show themselves to be hypocrites. The first two readings prepare us for this lesson by explaining how our behavior shows others what kind of people we are. Observing the commandments, Moses points out, shows other nations your wisdom. James exhorts his readers to put their beliefs into action. As we listen to the readings today, let us reflect on how we reveal ourselves in what we do.
