The recipe for the chicken legs and thighs is as follows: Wash and clean chicken, season, place chicken in large tray, add 1/2 cup water. Bake at 375 degrees skin side down for 45 minutes, turn chicken over, season and bake skin side up for an additional 45 minutes. When the chicken is done sprinkle with paprika.

Please drain all juices and transport the chicken in Ziploc bags.

The chicken is needed for this **Thursday, October 25th**. You may drop off at the chapel entrance 7:30-9:50 or the side parking lot at 9:45 am.

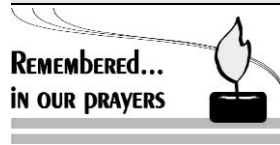
CATHOLIC DAUGHTERS

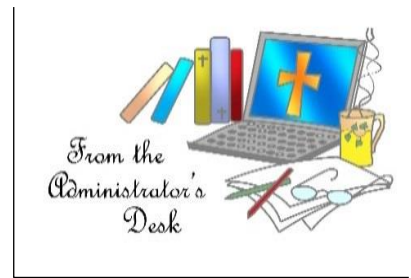
Dear Parishioners:

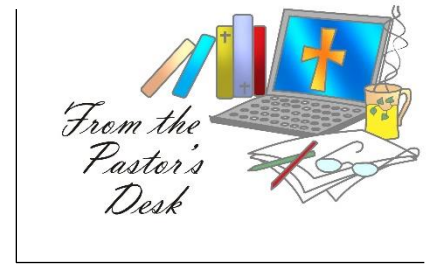

Every family has been touched.

The Cleansing of Ten Lepers.

“As Jesus continued His journey to Jerusalem, He traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As He was entering a village, ten lepers met Him. They stood at a distance from Him and raised their voice, saying, “Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!” And when He saw them, He said, “Go show yourselves to the priests.” As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked Him. He was a Samaritan. Jesus said in reply, “Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?” Then Jesus said to him, “Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.” (Luke 17:12-19)



Every family has been touched. Not necessarily with *breast cancer* or even any kind of cancer. But every family has been touched... with illness, with suffering, with pain, with depression, with addiction (alcohol, drug, sex, gambling), with death (of the aged, the young, a child, a sibling, a parent, a friend), with abuse (sexual, emotional, physical, mental)... every family is in need of healing. That is why it is worth meditating on the reading from the Gospel of Luke about the *Healing of the 10 Lepers*.

“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint (him) with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.” (James 5:14-15)

The miracle of healing is one of the signs of the coming Messiah... *“When the men came to Him (Jesus), they said, “John the Baptist has sent us to You to ask, ‘Are You the one who is to come (the Messiah), or should we look for another?’” At that time He (Jesus) cured many of their diseases, sufferings, and evil spirits; He also granted sight to many who were blind. And He said to them in reply, “Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the good news proclaimed to them.” (Luke 7:20-22)* But it is not just these outward signs that reveal that Jesus is God... *“Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above him. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, “Child, your sins are forgiven.” (Mark 2:4-5)* Jesus has shown us that we are to and should approach Him when we are in need of healing. As referred to above, every family has been touched, indeed every person is in need of healing, whether that be emotional, spiritual, mental or physical. We need to have faith that Jesus is “the One who is to come...” to us to heal, not only our fractured relationship with the Almighty, us in whatever way God determines we most need. Sometimes we feel that we should be healed of some physical ailment, but God knows, as a part of our path to salvation, we need to be healed more of spirit in accepting some physical pain rather than the pain itself.

So as we walk through life, either on two legs, three (with a cane), or six (with a walker), in recalling a loved who had cancer and survived, a loved one who had cancer and was called home to God, as a cancer survivor or one struggling with the disease, let us remember that firstly, *We Walk With God* or more truthfully, *God Walks With Us*, and secondly, that as we “walk” through life with our trials, tribulations, illnesses, challenges, depressions, addictions, abuses and pain, only Father, the Son and the Spirit can heal us... *“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint (him) with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.”*

Last week at the 12:00 pm Sunday Holy Mass, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was offered to all present. So many of you stayed to receive this special sacramental healing. At Saint Eugene Parish, every second Sunday at the 12:00 pm Holy Mass, will now be *Healing Sunday* with the Anointing of the Sick being offered.
