The recipe for the chicken legs and thighs is as follows: Wash and clean chicken, season, place chicken in large tray, add ½ cup water. Bake at 375 degrees skin side down for 45 minutes, turn chicken over, season and bake skin side up for an additional 45 minutes. When the chicken is done sprinkle with paprika.

Please drain all juices and transport the chicken in Ziploc bags.

The chicken is needed for this **Thursday, January 31st**. You may drop off at the chapel entrance 7:30-9:50 or the side parking lot at 9:45 am.

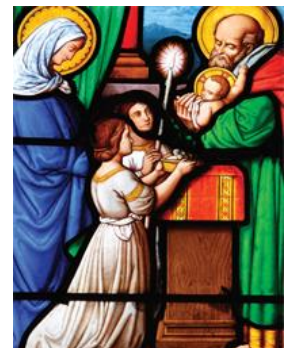
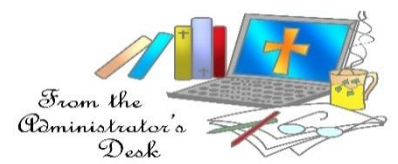

Presentation of Our Lord: Saturday, February 2, we celebrate Feast of the



Purification of the Virgin, or Candlemas Day. Counting forward from December 25 as Day One, we find that Day Forty is February 2.
