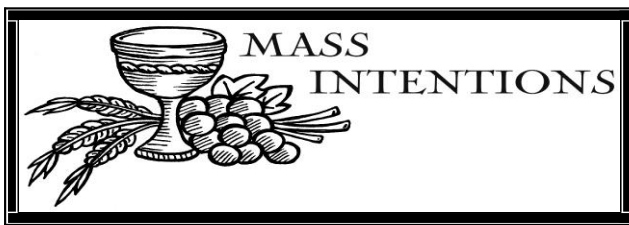

From the Parish House

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

My thanks to the members of our Finance Council as well as members of our parish staff for participating in our 'Town Hall' meeting last Tuesday evening. My thanks also to all of you who attended and asked pertinent questions. Questions not dealing directly with the financial report will be forwarded to our Pastoral Council for follow-up. We decided to hold such a meeting so that we would not have to inject a financial talk during Mass. I know that a few people wanted more minutiae, but since this was simply our yearly report and not a forensic audit, this is the format we chose. The Archdiocesan Parish Finance Office has reviewed our numbers, are satisfied that we have met their requirements, and have closed the book on the last financial year. My sincerest thanks to all of you who have so consistently and so generously contributed to the financial well-being of Holy Name of Mary Parish!

During this flu season, we need to take sensible precautions to help prevent the spread of this serious illness. One way to help minimize the spread of the flu is to frequently wash (or sanitize) your hands, and perhaps refrain from exchanging a handshake at the 'sign of peace' at Mass; a smile and head nod would be a good substitute. And if you have the sniffles or worse, please refrain from receiving the Precious Blood from the chalice. These simple actions may help you avoid contracting the flu, or help prevent its spread to others. You know the old adage: An ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure!

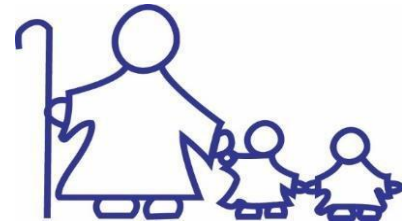
