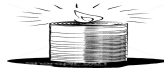

"The Son of Man will gather his elect from the four winds." (Mark 13:27)

Each month of November the Church remembers its faithfully departed. As believers we mourn their loss, we pray for their souls and it is our hope that one day we will meet them when we pass. Almost at the end of this liturgical year the readings also remind us of what will be the end of time. Even if we do not know the day or the hour, our hope rests on the faith we have in the God of Life.

Daniel prophesies about the resurrection of the dead in a concept quite advanced for his time. We recall that centuries later and already in Jesus' time this doctrine was a cause of division among the Jews who accepted or rejected the resurrection. For the author of the

Hebrews the emphasis, more than on the doctrine, is placed on the salvific action of Jesus for the forgiveness of all sins, of all people and for all times. Mark chapter 13 is known as "apocalyptic" because it describes the terrible signs that will occur at the "end of time."

However, even in the midst of chaos, destruction and death there remains hope for the elect who will be "reunited by the four winds."

Interestingly, the Prophet Daniel links justice to the doctrine of the resurrection. Only those who practice righteousness will be like those stars of heaven. That is why our future is forged in the here and now of our lives and in each of the decisions we make when we love and respect our own lives and the lives of others. We can not wait for eternal life if we do not work for justice for the little ones. When we see that the rights of the poor are violated and everything seems dark, both Jesus and the Prophet Daniel assure us victory for those who make up his holy people. However stormy the end of time, God remains stronger than any destructive force and is able to gather those he considers worthy.

We do not know the day or the time of the end of the world or of our own death. The truth is that we must be prepared. Our consolation is that we have been redeemed by Christ who died for our salvation and that if we practice justice, someday and somehow we will reach salvation and live forever.

BOYS AND GIRLS; LET US SING TO THE LORD - A Children's Choir is being formed to sing at the 4:00pm English mass, December 24th in our parish. Any child who wishes to participate in this music ministry is welcomed. There is NO age requirement specified to participate in the Children's Choir and NO experience is needed. We have had children from 3 years of age and others in high school. The basic requirement is that the child attends the practices. Each child must fill out a permission form and this can be obtained in the rectory.

CALLING ALL BOYS AND GIRLS; WOULD YOU LIKE TO SERVE JESUS AT THE ALTAR? - We invite any child who wants to provide services to the ministry of Altar Servers for all our Masses (including Spanish masses). You will be part of a training course in which you will learn the liturgical rituals to serve in a better way and proclaim the word of God with dignity. The only requirement is that the child has already received his/her First Holy Communion.
