SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism - First Sunday of the month in English at 1:00 pm. Second Saturday of the month in Spanish at 1:00 PM. Parents must meet with the pastor prior to the Baptism. Parents and Godparents are required to attend Baptismal instruction. Instruction is held same day as Baptism, prior to ceremony.

Reconciliation - 4:00 PM before the Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

Marriage - Couples are required to make arrangements one year to six months prior to the date of marriage. One party must be a registered and active member of this parish. Participation in Pre-marriage Program is required. Couple must meet with the pastor prior to any arrangements being made.

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 8, 2015

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.

It might not be a copper coin or oil or flour, but certainly I can give of myself, as the celebrated women of the scriptures did to teach me.

MOTHER CARRINI - November 13: Frances Xavier Cabrini died in Chicago on December 2, 1917; Red cabbage, the youngest of 13 brothers; He founded the Sisters of the Sacred Heart missionaries; for 28 years working in the United States and in South America, establishing 67 institutions (schools, hospitals and orphanages); It was the first American citizen to be canonized in 1946; Patron Saint of emigrants and migrants.
