Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ~ Corpus Christi

From The Desk of Msgr. Corrigan:

We have been reading about the early church and marveling at its eventual success. We can understand the first generation of believers. There are many religious groups who are able to hold their believers together for the first twenty years but then they gradually die out. Christianity was able to survive into the second, third generation and beyond; with that foundation they began to attract more and more people until eventually they became the dominant religion of the Roman Empire. There are many reasons for this success but for me a key reason was the celebration of the Eucharist or what we call today the Mass. From the earliest days they gathered together for prayer, learning about the life of Jesus and then had a meal of bread and wine which they believed was Jesus. This meal was the central binding force in their lives. It has kept us together, sustained us and energized us spiritually for 1,983 years. Today we celebrate this Eucharist, our spiritual food.

I heard a new expression this week: "Catholic in Exile". The usual expression is "I am a lapsed Catholic" I think this is a better name for people who deliberately (not just laziness) don't practice their religion anymore but still consider themselves Catholic. They may be ready to return to their homeland (Catholicism) when circumstances change.




First Reading: *Genesis 14:18-20 (page 45)* – Melchizedek, offers up bread and wine; he gives thanks to God for granting deliverance to his people.
