Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

From the Desk of Rev. Msgr. Hugh J. Corrigan:

St. Mary's is a parish of three language groups. We have Masses in each language; three in English, two in Spanish and one in Arabic. A few times a year we have a bilingual Mass in which two groups celebrate together e.g. Thanksgiving, Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and Midnight Mass at Christmas and Holy Thursday. Our parish council includes representative from all three language groups. However, it is rare for us to mix socially. The one time we try to come together socially is our Annual Dinner Dance in the Parish Hall where our first mass was celebrated in 1848. Celebrating our 168th anniversary this year, our dinner dance will be held on November 12th at 7:00pm. I strongly recommend that you buy a ticket (\$50.00 for adults, \$25.00 for children 7-12) and join your fellow parishioners for an enjoyable evening of food, music and dancing. Take the opportunity to introduce yourselves to fellow parishioners who you may never have met before. The future of our parish may depend on such interactions.

The fundraising campaign to raise money to repair our stained glass windows will reach out to all our parishioners in the middle of November. Some of you have already been contacted and you have responded generously. The name of the campaign is RENEW AND REBUILD.

The second collection this Sunday will be our monthly collection to aid with our Property Insurance.


