Symbols of Easter / Símbolos de Pascua / Symbole Wielkanocne

Another Easter folk custom -- one known all over Europe -- is that of watching the sun "dance" in joy for the risen Lord on Easter morning. The sun, already a symbol of Christ, is especially a symbol of Him as it rises and pierces the dawn on Easter Sunday. In the olden days, most people would go to a hilltop in the morning -- at dawn, just as the sun was rising like Christ rising from His tomb -- and wait to see if they could see the spectacle, sometimes watching the reflection of the sun in a lake or in a bucket of water. But a basin of water on an eastward-facing windowsill served (and serves) just as well. Of course, parents might surreptitiously give the basin a tiny shake to cause the waves that make the "miracle" manifest! (And, of course, too, God can well make the sun truly dance without our help!)

Many customs surrounding Easter are totally secular in origin, such as the German egg-laying Easter bunny traditions -- which are fine as long as they don't detract from the Season's meaning or become its focal point. Parents often put out baskets of candy "from the Easter Bunny" for the children to find on Easter morning -- baskets decorated with flowers and ribbons, lined inside with grass, and filled with chocolate bunnies, chocolate eggs, Jordan almonds, jelly beans, and other candies. In any case, here's one recipe to help you fill an Easter basket:

Easter Nests (makes 15)

- 2 cups butterscotch chips
- 1 cup peanut butter chips
- 2 TBSP shortening (not butter, margarine, or oil)
- 3 cups crunchy Chow Mein noodles
- Jelly beans, Jordan almonds, Peanut M&Ms, or other egg-shaped candies

In double boiler or microwave, melt together all the chips and the shortening. Fold in noodles and stir to coat. On waxed paper, using 1/3 cupful of the mixture for each one, form 3-inch nests. Chill for 30 minutes. Place a few of your favorite candies in each nest to appear as eggs. Store airtight in refrigerator. Chocolate chips can be used in place of butterscotch chips for a different flavor and look.

Parents often hold Easter egg hunts for the children, too -- hiding painted eggs around the yard for them to find. One egg is often painted a special color, and the child who finds this one is a winner of the contest as is the child who finds the most number of eggs.

-- but, as said, all of these fun things need to be kept in check so that the focus of the day isn't lost. I strongly, strongly urge your telling your children the story of Moses and the Passover (Exodus 2-12), and their being types of -- their foreshadowing -- Christ and the hope of salvation through the Blood of Christ as evidenced by the Resurrection.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Peter preaches to the Gentiles for the first time in the house of Cornelius. Peter realized that God would accept any person who acted uprightly, regardless of his or her heritage. Then the Holy Spirit descended on the Gentiles and Peter allowed them to be baptized in the name of Jesus.

Second Reading: I John 4:7-10

John advises all believers to love one another, for love is a gift from God. The person without love does not know God, whose love for us is so great he sent his only son so that we might have life through him.

Gospel: John 15:9-17

Jesus asks his disciples to live on in his love and to "Love one another as I have loved you." He explains that he chose them to follow him, and promises if they keep his commandments they will have anything that they ask for in his name.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera Lectura: Hechos 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Pedro predica a los gentiles por primera vez en la casa de Cornelio. Pedro se da cuenta de que Dios aceptaría a cualquier persona que se conduzca rectamente, sin importar su descendencia. Entonces el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los gentiles y Pedro permitió que fueran bautizados en el nombre de Jesús.

Segunda Lectura: 1 Juan 4:7-10

Juan le aconseja a los creyentes que se amen los unos a los otros, ya que el amor es un regalo de Dios. La persona sin amor no conoce a Dios, cuyo amor por nosotros es tan grande que envió a su único hijo para que pudiéramos vivir a través de El.

Evangelio: Juan 15:9-17

Jesús les pide a sus discípulos vivir en su amor y "que se amen unos a otros como yo los he amado a ustedes". Explica que los escogió para que lo siguieran, y les promete que si siguen sus mandamientos ellos tendrán cualquier cosa que pidan en su nombre.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William Reilly

"Jesus said to his disciples, 'As the Father loves Me, so I also love you. Remain in My love. If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept the Father's commandments and remain in His love... This is My commandment: love one another as I love you... It was not you who chose Me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain... This I command you: love one another.'"

In His prayer Jesus is preparing the disciples for their work when He takes leave of them. How frequently John's gospel uses the word 'remain', stay close, be cemented, don't stray. Besides telling them what to do, He assures them that He too will be part of their lives for He loves, not just loved them.

He then gives them the task to put into action, to go and bear fruit. Am I unsure or afraid what the Lord asks of me? I shouldn't be, because I am both loved by Him at this moment, and He has both chosen me and appointed me. He is waiting for my response.

SU PALABRA HOY por el Rev. William Reilly

"Como el Padre me amó, también yo los he amado a ustedes. Permanezcan en mi amor. Si cumplen mis mandamientos, permanecerán en mi amor. como yo cumplí los mandamientos de mi Padre y permanezco en su amor... Este es mi mandamiento: Amense los unos a los otros, como yo los he amado... En su oración, Jesús prepara a sus discípulos para el trabajo que les encomienda cuando El los deja. A menudo en los evangelios se utiliza la palabra 'permanecer', quedar cerca, estar afianzado, no alejarse. Además de indicarles qué hacer, les asegura que El también será parte de las vidas de aquellos que lo aman, además de amarlos.

Luego les da una tarea para poner en acción, la de ir y dar fruto. ¿Tengo miedo, o no estoy seguro de lo que el Señor me pide? No debe ser así, ya que soy amado por El en este momento, y El me ha elegido y destinado. El espera mi respuesta.

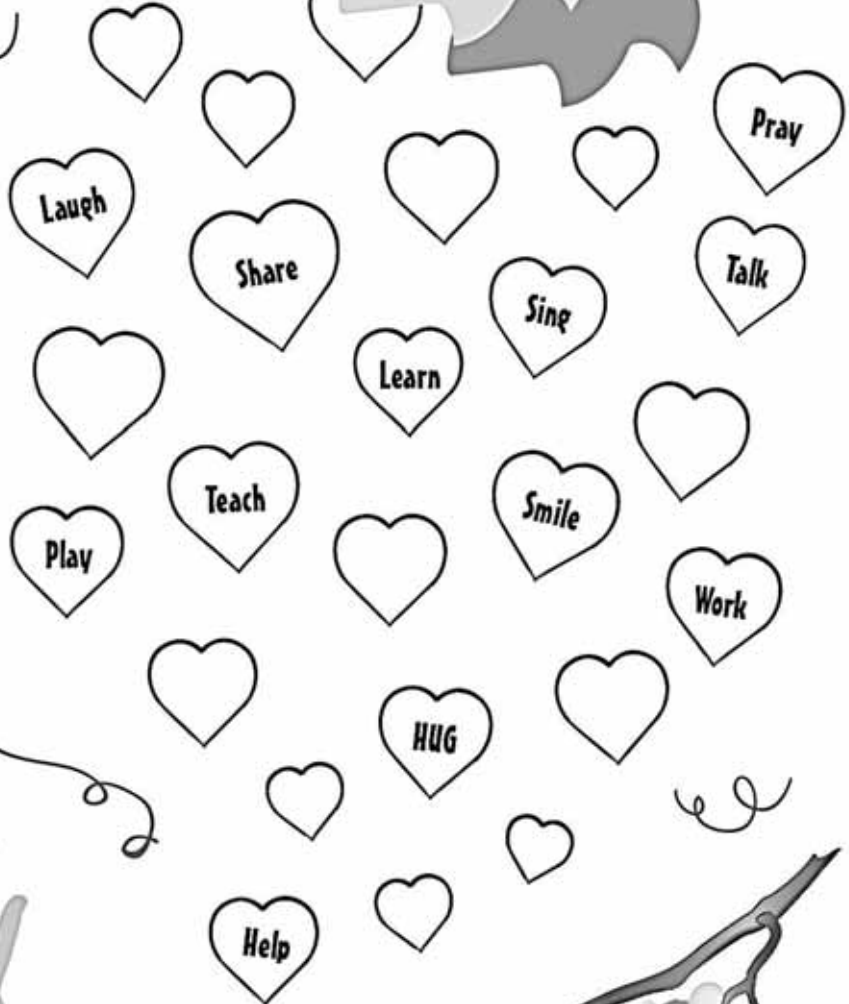
