stay home when you are sick; cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing; wash your hands often; avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth; and practice other good health habits, such as get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious food.

Though the single best way to prevent getting the flu is to get the flu vaccine each year, washing your hands often will help protect you from getting and spreading germs, and can cut your flu risk in half. What is the right way to wash your hands? Remember: Wet, Lather, Scrub, Rinse, and Dry:

- * Wet your hands with clean, warm, running water and apply soap.
- * Rub your hands together to make a lather and scrub them well for at least 20 seconds; be sure to scrub the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- * Rinse your hands well under running water.
- *Dry your hands using a clean towel or air-dry them.
- * Shut the faucet off with the paper towel and exit the door using the paper towel on the handle.

Washing your hands with soap and water is the best way to reduce the number of germs on them. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub for 15 seconds and follow label instructions
