12th. Sunday in Ordinary Time June 25, 2017

First Reading: Jeremiah 20:10-13

While the prophet has been sad, these verses express a strong confidence in Yahweh's promise.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-15

God's love assures salvation to those who are justified by faith, and it bestows a freedom from sin and death. All this comes to us through the "new Adam," who is Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 10:26-33

The ministry of preaching intimidates the Apostles. So Jesus encourages them by asking them to think how God cares even about "two sparrows," which are the cheapest of the sacrificial offerings. How much more are they worth than many sparrows?

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Anyone who witnessed it that bright October day will never forget it. I refer to the first homily preached to the world by the newly-elected Pope John Paul II, now a saint, at his Mass of inauguration. New to the white robes, the vigorous young pope from Poland began dramatically by declaring "Be not afraid!" That phrase would become the hallmark of his pontificate, destined to be one of the longest in history.

Indeed, the year 1978 had been one of continuous sorrow for the Catholic world. Pope Paul VI had died in August after a long illness. Then came the smiling John Paul I on the scene, but his hopeful reign lasted only 33 days.

So, to hear "Be not afraid!" strongly pronounced and vigorously underscored by a new pope's gesture of holding out his staff to the crowd somewhat like a baton was exciting and uplifting. It was new day! Hope had a helper!

That whole event came to mind when I reflected on today's Gospel scene, particularly at Our Lord's exhortation to his nervous Twelve, about to go on their first missions. Like a good sports coach, Jesus huddled with them and boldly said "Fear no one!" What He undoubtedly gave those men was something called "confidence." Confidence in Him. Confidence in the message they were going to deliver. May I ask, "Are you confident in your mission? In your Catholic faith?"

In this context, I wonder if the whole Church might

benefit from celebrating what I might call a "Confidence Sunday." It seems like we all would. My idea is not so fanciful as to be ridiculous. After all, we already have a Divine Mercy Sunday, a Religious Vocation Sunday, a Mission Sunday, and a Respect Life Sunday. Each of those calls for a definite trust in God. My proposal would simply make confidence in Him our direct focus. Today's Readings would be the perfect ones for that day's Mass.

Whether or not such a thing ever happens, we know that confidence includes not only a certainty about God, but also a belief in oneself as His agents. Granted, we are not flawless creatures. We humbly acknowledge such every time we gather for Mass. What do we begin with, but "I confess...that I have greatly sinned?"

But we also have to remember that we are a redeemed people. Our Creed proclaims that, does it not? Join that with power from Christ and we can join Jeremiah to say "Praise the Lord!"

Of course, we always have to be careful that we never give the credit for our blessings to the wrong source. The story is told of a carpenter who was nailing shingles on the roof of a house. He lost his footing and started to slide off. As he was sliding he began praying, "Lord, oh Lord, help me!" Still, he kept sliding. Again the man prayed, "Lord, oh Lord, help me!" He kept sliding until he got to the edge of the roof and a nail sticking up caught hold of his pants. After he came to a stop he said, "Never mind, Lord. The nail's got hold of me now."
