Reading 2 Heb 9:24-28

Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands, a copy of the true one, but heaven itself, that he might now appear before God on our behalf.

Gospel Mk 12:38-44

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers.

Understanding the Bible 2/3

1. ***The Bible isn't a book. It's a library.*** The Bible is a collection of 73 books written over the course of many centuries. The books include royal history, prophecy, poetry, challenging letters to struggling new faith communities, and believers' accounts of the preaching and passion of Jesus.
2. ***Know what the Bible is – and what it isn't.*** The Bible is the story of God's relationship with the people he has called to himself. It is not intended to be read as history text, science, or politics.
3. ***The sum is greater than the parts.*** Read the Bible in context. What happens before and after – even in other books – helps us to understand the true meaning of the text.
