## CALLED TO BE BLESSED... AND MORE!

As has become a custom at Assumption, our Church will once more offer a five-week Pre-Lenten Preaching Series. This year, during the weeks leading up to Ash Wednesday (March 1), the Preaching Series will zero in on the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew Chapters 5 – 7), from which each Gospel reading of those five weeks is drawn. Exploring the unifying theme "Called to be...", a special homily will be delivered at each Mass on a particular weekend. Beginning next weekend (**Saturday, January 28 and Sunday, January 29**), the initial message will be "Called to be blessed." Over the following four weeks, the focus will be on "Called to be light"; "Called to be peace"; "Called to be love"; and "Too blessed to be stressed."

## MARCH FOR LIFE THIS FRIDAY

The pilgrimage to Washington, DC for the annual March for Life is this **Friday, January 27**. Forty-four years ago, the Supreme Court handed down its decision in Roe vs. Wade, legalizing abortion and leading to the deaths of more than 60 million babies in the United States. Please join hundreds of thousands of marchers from around the nation to stop abortion. The cost is \$40 per person. The day begins with a 5:00 am Mass at Assumption, with our bus transportation scheduled to depart for DC at 6:00 am; anticipated return time is between 10:00 – 11:00 pm. Please bring your lunch, and dress warmly and comfortably! In addition, Assumption is sponsoring an overnight youth trip (**Thursday, January 26 into Friday, January 27**) for young people (Grades 8 and above) to attend the Vigil Mass and a "Life is Very Good" evening prayer on Thursday, then participate in the Youth Rally and March on Friday. ## FAMED PREACHER COMING TO ASSUMPTION



Assumption is pleased to announce that Saulo Hidalgo – renowned lay Catholic preacher and minister of healing – will be coming to our Church in mid-February for a Healing Mass and a Pre-Lenten Retreat. Mr.

Hidalgo, born in the Dominican Republic and residing in Texas, will preach at both the Healing Mass and during the day of retreat.

**Friday, February 10:** The evening of the Healing Mass begins at 6:30 pm with recitation of the Rosary. Father Vincent Druding will then celebrate Mass at 7:00 pm, followed by a Eucharistic Procession. Mr. Hidalgo will preach after the Procession and Benediction. A laying-on-of-hands service concludes the evening. (Music during the evening will be provided by the Kevin Donovan Band.)

**Saturday, February 11:** The Pre-Lenten Retreat will begin at 8:30 am with recitation of the Rosary and a Mass at 9:00 am; a light breakfast will be served, followed by a day of talks by Mr. Hidalgo. Agnus Dei Ministries will provide Praise and Worship music throughout the day, which will also include a Holy Hour, discussion and a break for lunch. The cost of the Retreat is \$10 per person and is open to all age 15 and above. ## NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
January 29, 2017

The season the Church calls "Ordinary Time" is anything but ordinary! One comes to this conclusion based on an examination of the Gospel readings for weekdays and Sundays from the end of Christmastide until the beginning of Lent. Ordinary Time is not penitential. The color of vestments is green, not purple. Green – a color of life, of growth, of hope.

It is a time of feasting, not fasting. Jesus is challenged, "Why do the disciples of John and... the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?" He answers, "Can the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is with them?" (Matthew 9:14-15) Translation: He, the Bridegroom, is here. We must feast!

It is fitting that Ordinary Time begins in the month of January, a word taken from the Latin *ianua* (door). In Roman mythology the two-headed "god of doors," Janus, had the ability to look back, perhaps with regret, and to look ahead, with resolution. January opens a new year, an opportunity to make a fresh start.

The initial weeks of Ordinary Time call for "new wineskins." We are the new wineskins; the Lord is the new wine. Like new wineskins, we must be supple, giving the "wine" of the Spirit room to "ferment" so He can stretch, fill and intoxicate us, just as the Twelve were exhilarated by their early journeys with the Lord among His people – His Bride!

The Gospel readings, therefore, are exciting and celebratory. Jesus' mission has begun. The Baptist's disciples become the disciples of Jesus. He chooses the Twelve. His preaching is new and authoritative, and His following is growing.

The momentum culminates in the Gospel reading for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time – the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5), with its sometimes paradoxical pronouncements: "Blessed are the poor... the meek... the persecuted." Healings abound! Incredible miracles are worked for the deaf, dumb and blind, the lame and the leper! Demons are expelled! Most astounding of all, He forgives sins!

In BLEST ARE THEY (#627), American author and composer David Haas sets the Beatitudes to a joyful melody. CHRIST IN ME ARISE (#513), by Trevor Nash Thomson, acknowledges the power of the presence of Christ in the baptized soul and in the Eucharist. He writes, "We are good because the Creator...calls us His beloved."

Choir will sing both pieces on January 29.
