**NOTES FROM THE LOFT**

The Place of Chant in Worship

The children of the Church speak many languages, a direct consequence of being "catholic" (i.e., universal) – existing everywhere and at all times.

Yet, She, the Church, has a language of her own: an ancient one, known even to Jesus – Latin – and She is eager for her children to be able to sing (which is musical speech) in their mother tongue.

American parishes are increasingly multilingual and their music multicultural. In this diversity there is, however – and more than ever – a need for a liturgical "common denominator." This will be the subject of a workshop titled "Gregorian Chant as a Unifying Force in Multiethnic Parishes" at the upcoming national conference "Gregorian Chant in Pastoral Ministry and Religious Education" to be held at St. Joseph's Seminary next weekend.

(We are proud to say that, on this First Sunday of Lent, Assumption's Spanish parishioners will have taken that "quantum leap" into Chant with its introduction at their weekend Masses!)

For some years now, Assumption has been following the 1967 directive "*Musicam Sacram*" (Instruction on Music in the Liturgy), issued by the Vatican shortly after the close of Vatican II. Paragraph 47 states: "Pastors of souls should take care that, besides the vernacular, 'the faithful also know how to say or sing, in Latin also, those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them.'"

During the season of Lent, the Assumption community returns to its practice of singing the "Roman Missal Chants" for the Ordinary parts of the Mass: the KYRIE (Lord, Have Mercy), the SANCTUS (Holy, Holy, Holy), the AGNUS DEI (Lamb of God) and the PATER NOSTER (Our Father). (These can be found in the back of our missalette, beginning with #839.)

The Choir will continue to draw from its singer-friendly repertoire of Gregorian Chant. ATTENDE, DOMINE (#118) dates from the Tenth Century. Written in Mode 5, it is light and lilting. However, the Responsorial Psalm, taken from Psalm 51, when chanted as the Latin MISERERE is plaintive and mournful. It is the sorrowful song of a penitent King David lamenting his lust for Bathsheba, the loss of the child they conceived, and the plot which took her husband's life. It will be chanted at the incensing of the gifts.

Look forward to more insights into Chant as we journey through Lent.

### OUR RCIA CANDIDATES AND CATECHUMENS



This **Sunday, March 5**, Assumption is sending a group of Catechumens to St. Patrick’s Cathedral to be recognized by Cardinal Timothy Dolan and confirm their intention of joining the Catholic Church through Baptism at the Easter Vigil Mass.

In addition, two groups of Candidates – one from our English RCIA program, the other from our Spanish program – will celebrate the Rite of Continuing Conversion in our Church next **Sunday, March 12** (the English Candidates at the 10:00 am Mass, the Spanish Candidates at the 7:00 pm Mass), when they reaffirm their intention to be received into full communion with the Church. Both groups of Candidates will then enter a period of final preparation of deepening their relationship with Christ and purifying their minds and hearts as they progress toward receiving the sacraments of Holy Communion and/or Confirmation at the Easter Vigil Mass.

During the Third, Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent (March 19, March 26 and April 2), we will join with these “Elect” in celebrating the “Scrutinies” – so named because they encourage us to scrutinize our lives – through prayers of conversion, repentance and intercession intended to deliver the Elect from sin, protect them from temptation and invite them into a closer relationship with Christ.

Please pray for our Catechumens and Candidates at this important period of formation in their spiritual lives.

### A VERY SPECIAL HEALING MASS ON APRIL 1

We all know someone in need of healing – physical, emotional and/or spiritual healing. ## BEHIND THE SCENES AT ASSUMPTION

It takes many people to see to it that a parish runs smoothly. In our continuing series highlighting parish employees and volunteers, we focus this week on John Mulrone, "Matthew 25" Coordinator at Assumption.



*"My name is John Mulrone, and I volunteer with Matthew 25, our charity program at Assumption. I'm in the Rectory almost daily, providing help to those with many types of needs.*

*Sometimes the solution to a problem is financial; if we cannot address it, we'll find organizations that can. We help those who are homeless find housing, sometimes with the assistance of parishioners and sometimes with help from organizations in Westchester. There are many in Peekskill who struggle with addictions; we try to find programs and counseling for those who are ready to make a change in their lives. We have even helped parishioners move within the local area when they could not afford professional moving companies.*

*Many households struggle to put food on the table. We have a small food pantry at the Rectory and also provide info about other local pantries and when the mobile food distribution from the Food Bank for Westchester will be in Peekskill.*

*Working with Father Higgins and Father Vincent, as well as with the staff and volunteers who frequent the Rectory, is both challenging and enjoyable. There is always work to do because there are always those in need of help. But we have great parishioners – whatever the situation or circumstance, someone always steps up to provide much-needed assistance.*

*My young adulthood was spent in the military. Later, I worked in the financial services sector. My training in financial analysis has helped me provide guidance to those who come to Matthew 25.*

*I've lived in a number of locations throughout the country but have made my home in the Hudson Valley for more than a dozen years; I've been in Peekskill for a bit more than two years. This is a great part of the country in which to live, and Assumption is a great parish. I feel blessed to be here and to be able to be part of Matthew 25."*
