A PRIMER IN INDULGENCES

One of the sorrows of the this modern era is the loss among Catholics of a sense of the great spiritual power of our prayers and sacrifices (like fasting and penance). In particular, most Catholics are sadly unaware of the gift of the indulgence. This neglect of what has been and still is very much part of Catholic teaching is mostly due to a misunderstanding which arose out of Martin Luther's anger at the Church and the abuse of selling indulgences that became a catalyst for his rebellion nearly five centuries ago.

Our Catholic Catechism defines an indulgence as that favor obtained through the Church which is granted to individual Christians for the remission of both temporal and eternal punishments due to sins and which helps to bring about communion with the Father. While the guilt of sin may already been forgiven through Sacramental Confession, sin still has consequences or effects for our life here and in eternity and requires repair or satisfaction. (Thus, we understand the necessity of Purgatory.) The Church's grant of indulgences, coming from the binding and loosing power given her by Jesus, is meant to be spur towards greater works of devotion, penance and charity.

In essence, Christians who seek an indulgence from the Church avail themselves of the satisfaction obtained by Christ for the sins of the world and from the saints who shared in his victory over death. This "treasury" of merits is shared abundantly through "a perennial link of charity exist[ing] between the faithful who have already reached their heavenly home, those who are expiating their sins in purgatory and those who are still pilgrims on earth. Between them there is, too, an abundant exchange of all good things." Yes, you heard that right: indulgences can be granted at our behest to our beloved dead who, while not yet saints, are being purified by God's love (and ours).

This Jubilee Year of Mercy declared by Pope Francis offers a special possibility of attaining an indulgence for the benefit of the Faithful (and the Faithful departed) through a pilgrimage to one of the holy sites established by Cardinal Dolan here in the Archdiocese and by intentionally entering through the Door of Mercy at each site. *Locally, we can visit the National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Middletown the National Shrine of Mary Help of*

Christians in Stony Point (the others: St. Patrick's Cathedral, Old St. Patrick's Cathedral, and St. Frances Cabrini Shrine).

Baptized Catholics in the state of grace (free from mortal or grave sin) who have the intention of gaining a plenary indulgence due to sins already forgiven must:

- * Have an interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial or less grace sin;
- * Go to Confession within twenty days after making the pilgrimage to the Door of Mercy
- * Receive the Holy Eucharist within twenty days after visiting the Door of Mercy
- * Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father within twenty days after visiting the Door of Mercy. Recommended prayers include a Profession of Faith (as from Sunday's Mass), one "Our Father," or one "Hail Mary."
- * If possible, it is appropriate but not necessary that the above take place at the time of the visit.
