

SAINT JOHN VIANNEY

Born of peasant stock in Dardilly, France, John desired from a young age to be a priest. After years of difficult study in the seminary, he was ordained and assigned to the village of Ars, near Lyons. He brought Christ to his parishioners through the fervent celebration of the Eucharist, assistance to the poor, and above all, the Sacrament of Penance. Reputed to have the gift of seeing souls, he spent

between eleven and sixteen hours a day reconciling sinners to God. Hundreds of Pilgrims availed themselves of his aid every week. The Curé was still hearing confessions from his bed a few days before his death on August 4, 1859. Saint John Vianney is the patron saint of priests.

WHAT HAPPENED TO CCD?

Recently I wrote in this space about our parish religious education program. Given the circumstances, our search for a new director of religious education, and the scary statistics from the many studies that most of our young adults have left the faith of their fathers and mothers, the moment seemed right to reimagine how we might pass on the faith to our children so that they become lifelong learners and not lifelong "leavers."

For many years, our programs for religious education classes were called C.C.D. but now our notion of religious education or faith formation not only includes the need to catechize Millennials, but X-ers and Baby Boomers as well. "Catechesis" is the broader term for educating children, youth and adults in an understanding and appreciation of their Faith. Formation then is for all members of the Church, but what is CCD and why don't we use the acronym any more?

In 1536 a "confraternity" or society of lay people formed in Milan to help educate the poor and uneducated people of the time in their faith. This particular group of lay people dedicated themselves as teachers to bring the Good News to those deprived of education and became known as the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine or CCD.

When in 1571, Pope Pius V said this Confraternity should be established around the world, the Confraternity increased, and included religious congregations founded expressly for the purpose of bringing the faith to the poor. In time, some of these religious congregations of men and women also began teaching secular education in schools to needy children.

In the United States, CCD became more active when the Second (1866) and Third (1884) Plenary Councils of Baltimore encouraged its establishment in every parish. CCD became very strong particularly in urban areas with immigrants and by 1935 a national center for CCD was established. (A footnote: the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in

the United States owns the publishing to the New American Bible, the source for our Sunday readings at Mass.)

These original CCDs were supported by a board and were highly structured at the time. No Confraternity member could begin to teach without rigorous training and preparation. They were noted for great zeal. In time, especially as Catholic schools increased in number in the Northeast United States, more families came to depend on a parochial school to ensure their children knew about Christ and the Faith, and sadly, CCD became the poor stepchild to her better financed and clearly preferred option of Catholic education. Its organization and administration was often centered in diocesan institutions that did their best to ensure that leaders and teachers in the faith were well prepared and programs well administered.

Of course, the Second Vatican Council provided a new focus on what was taught and how it was taught. Convened more than fifty years ago, its prevailing thought was to bring all Catholics to a more conscious and active participation in the sacred mysteries of Faith, including and especially the celebration of the Mass. The Baltimore Catechism, a systematic memorization of the tenets of the Faith, was replaced by many and varied catechetical guides.

Unfortunately, in the fifty years hence, CCD has often failed to keep pace with many of the advancement in education that our Catholic and public education have embraced. While devoted and generous volunteers, pour out their hearts to share the faith they love with the children of their parish, the challenges of our modern world and a broad culture unfriendly to faith meant that our families find themselves swimming against the tide in making the faith central to their lives.

Where are we as a parish headed? We pray not to see the faith of our families so diluted, so diminished that the parish is no longer relevant! Do you want to know more? Do you think you'd like to help? An informational meeting will be held in the parish on Sunday, August 20 after the 11:00 am Mass (in St. Thomas School gym).
