A MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

We are pleased to report that the parish is currently operating at a \$215,047 surplus compared to a budgeted deficit of \$27,521 for the first six months of this fiscal year ending February 28, 2015. **These favorable results are due to both increased giving and reduced spending.** We received a generous bequest of \$75,000 during this period and have been blessed with increases in Sunday collections, weddings, and the Christmas collection. Our Sunday offertory collections are 15.4% higher than last year, due in part to the success of our *Sharing God's Gifts Increased Giving Initiative* conducted last fall. Our sincere thanks to all who are participating in this important program.

Such good news must be balanced by remembering the significant expenses yet to come. Our heating bill for this winter, the need for new flooring behind the apse, the *"Take Back the Tap"* water justice initiative, our new fire alarm system, and several other projects will consume much of our present surplus, and all with good reason.

Our Faith Direct e-giving option continues to grow both in the number of participants and percentage of our total Sunday collections. In March, we had 281 parishioners donating 48% of the total collection compared to 235 parishioners and 37% of the total collection in September. We encourage those not using Faith Direct to consider enrolling as you will be able to support our parish each and every week, even if you are out of town, or unable to attend services due to weather or other circumstances. Using Faith Direct will also win you points and rewards through your credit card.

In other news, last month we were pleased to welcome Andrew Royston, Audit Manager for Deloitte and Touche, as the newest member of the Finance Council, succeeding Tim O'Connor who completed 17 years of dedicated and valuable service. We are very grateful for Tim's efforts and we also want to thank the other six parishioners who came forward to selflessly offer their time and talent to serve on the Council. Thank you Tim and welcome Andrew!

Finally, stewardship calls us to imitate the early Christians we hear about today in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles: *"The community of believers was of one heart and mind and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own."* - Acts 4:32 . All that we are and all that we have is a gift from God! Think of your family, your friends, your talents and abilities – these are all gifts from God. We aren't really owners of anything, we are merely "stewards" of the gifts God has blessed us with. Our continued thanks to all who support SFX with their time, talent, and treasure.

The Church of Saint Francis Xavier, the AIDS Crisis, and Our Commitment to AIDS WALK NY

“Sometimes it is wise to ‘mind your own business.’ When it comes to the needs of others, however, their business IS our business. That’s the Ignatian way.” --Joe Paprocki, DMin. Loyola Press.

As early as the 1930’s, there was a form of HIV that would mutate into what we now refer to as HIV. In 1959, the first known case of HIV in a human developed in a man who died in the Congo. It is suggested that the virus may have first arrived in the United States in 1968. In 1981, the first patient to have died of AIDS in the US was reported. By the end of that year, 121 people were known to have died from the disease. It wasn’t until 1982 that AIDS was declared an epidemic. The Gay Men’s Health Crisis (GMHC) organization was established in NYC and Larry Kramer’s own story of GMHC’s beginnings was told in his play *The Normal Heart*.

I started attending Mass at Saint Francis Xavier sometime in the mid-1980s because of its commitment to the spiritual growth of the gay person. I had walked by the church many times but had never stopped in until I heard the music from the street one afternoon; it was probably the 5 PM Mass. The Church of Saint Francis Xavier has always practiced the Jesuit values of compassion and active social justice. Then I heard that Xavier had buried a friend of a friend, at a time when few other Catholic institutions in NYC were brave enough to care for those infected by HIV/AIDS. Xavier was and is pastorally committed to inclusiveness as Jesus asked of all His followers, outreach to those in need. “One God, One Body.”

Xavier’s HIV/AIDS ALTAR OF REMEMBRANCE became known as a place for people to come and remember those we’ve lost, pray for those who are living, and rededicate ourselves for stopping the epidemic. In the mid 90’s, the altar was officially dedicated as the parish response to the epidemic and word spread to many other people, places, and parishes. In 1996, the Gonzaga Group was formed; a group dedicated to serving the spiritual needs of anyone with HIV/AIDS’s.

This year marks 30 years of AIDS WALK NY and dare I say 30 years of Xavier’s commitment to supporting this worthy cause. The funds raised at the event remain a vital lifeline that sustains GMHC’s prevention, care, and advocacy programs for the thousands of men, women, and families affected by the disease in the tri-state area. At a recent fundraiser, the current GMHC CEO Kelsey Louie said “We must aspire to a cure once and for all. Let’s demand a cure and a society that values people with HIV enough to pay for it. Only if we aspire to more can we demand more. Only if we demand more will we get more.”

This year’s AIDS Walk NY will take place on Sunday, May 17th. Please consider making a donation next weekend in the back of the church or help us by joining our team and raising money yourself. Our parish has been among the top 20 fund raisers (excluding major corporations) for the last several years because of YOU. God bless you all and know that I am always grateful for the support of the Xavier staff and its community of believers.

Second Sunday of Easter: Acts 4:32-35;
1 John 5:1-6; John 20:19-31. *They were of one heart and mind. Whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. Eight days later Jesus came and stood in their midst.*

John 6:1-15. *The Apostles went out rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name. Jesus distributed to those who were reclining as much as they wanted.*

Second Saturday of Easter: Acts 6:1-7;
John 6:16-21. *They chose seven men filled with the Holy Spirit. They saw Jesus, walking on the sea.*

Third Sunday of Easter: Acts 3:13-15, 17-19;
1 John 2:1-5a; Luke 24:35-48. *The author of life you put to death, but God raised Him from the dead. Jesus Christ is expiation not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. Thus it was written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day.*
