

Making the Case to Support Xavier and Year-end Giving

First we want to thank all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support our parish throughout the year. Part of our Stewardship Plan is to increase awareness of the parish's financial needs and obligations and encourage increased giving to help reduce the size of our forecasted operating deficits in the years ahead. In September we outlined in the bulletin our \$2.1 million operating budget and the various programs that your donations help support. Since then we have been asked to contribute an additional \$100,000 annually to support the Global Regional School System of the Archdiocese.

This year we are budgeting a deficit of \$173,502 and are projecting operating deficits totaling \$619,000 over the next 5 years until the restoration loan is paid off. To help reduce our deficits and continue to fund our programs without the need to use our cash reserves we conducted an increased giving program last fall with the goal of increasing our Sunday collection by 25% over the previous year. Although we did not reach our stated goal we did increase our Sunday collections by 17.1%. **Our thanks to all those who participated in this program.** Although we have sufficient cash reserves to cover these deficits, our reserves will fall below the level we've set aside to fund unexpected building repairs or other emergencies.

Over the past five years we have emphasized our reliance on the income from our 17th St. rental property to help sustain the basic operations of the parish. To illustrate that point we have shown below what our deficit would be if our budget no longer included the rental income and our loan payment. Last year our rental income was \$10,000 more than our Sunday collections.

Through financial transparency in the publishing of quarterly and annual reports, and other information in the bulletin each of us now has knowledge of parish finances, enabling one to make an informed decision around parish support. In light of the above, we ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your total giving, especially your Sunday, maintenance, and holiday collections. Our goal is to increase our total collections by 20% over last year. Such an increase will allow us eliminate this year's projected deficit! By way of example if each parishioner contributing \$20 each week, increased the amount they give each week to \$24 we could completely eliminate this year's projected deficit. We recognize that some of you may not be able to increase your giving or to that level, but perhaps there are others who are doing better and can contribute more.

As the end of the year approaches, we begin to reflect upon the many blessings bestowed upon us. The end of the year also provides a great opportunity to thank God for these blessings by gifting to the parish. The benefits of income tax deductions, capital gains savings and other financial benefits are significant advantages that provide an incentive to make a gift at the year-end. A gift can also help support the parish for years to come. There are many different ways of contributing a gift.

Two of the easiest and most direct methods to gift are donations of cash and appreciated stock or other investments. You can also make other financially advantageous gifts such as real estate, life insurance, charitable remainder trusts, gift annuities, will/trust bequests and IRA/retirement accounts.
