ANNUAL CARD SALE FOR HONDURAS PROJECT

On Nov. 15, Padre Melo from Honduras visited our church and spoke about the purposes of his work and the mission of the Jesuit radio station, *Radio Progreso*, which he heads. He stated that the intent is to highlight injustices and violations of human rights, and to look at the root causes of those violations. The main areas of focus are youth formation, defense of natural resources from incursions by mining companies, formation of new organizations to defend human rights, and creation of support networks in communities to provide an alternative voice to that of the government.

As in previous years, the Honduras Companion Communities Project will offer a selection of Alternative Giving cards for sale after the masses during the weekends of Advent. The cards provide a way for you to remember friends and loved ones and to contribute to supporting the education of a new generation of Hondurans which is so essential to Padre Melo's goals. Xavier and its parishioners have supported our efforts with several local community groups in Honduras for the last 15 years. The selection this year is again based on artwork created by the children who live in *Casa Corazon*, a home operated by the Sisters of Mercy for children who are HIV+. Aside from printing expenses, you can be sure that all the proceeds from the sale flow directly to our local community groups in Honduras. As always, thank you for your support!

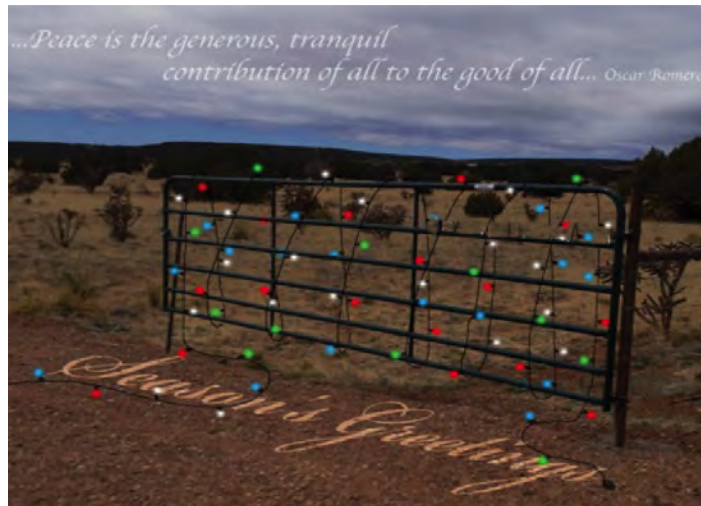
