### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

The first reading this weekend is taken from the book of the prophet Jonah. It's one of the most comical and yet most revelatory of who God is. Jonah is a "caricature" of a prophet who is reluctant to do God's will because he doesn't really like who God is. It's unfortunate that we only get to hear a few verses from an otherwise compelling story of human prejudice and divine mercy. (If you happened to be at the 9am liturgy, you would have heard and seen a "ritual play" that I wrote years ago. Although it doesn't tell the story in its entirety, it portrays Jonah as a reluctant prophet who runs away from God because God is so merciful. Jonah can't stand the fact that God's mercy will extend to a race of people whom he despises. Jonah ends up in a "Whale of a Therapy Session" in the "belly of Welly" as this wise Whale attempts to help Jonah see his bigotry and come to know a God who would rather forgive than punish. There is a contemporary poignancy in the story in that ancient Nineveh is part of the modern day city of Mosul that has suffered so much in the Iraq war and in occupation by ISIS and from which thousands of Assyrian Christians have fled.

As we all know so painfully, these past weeks since the beginning of the New Year have not brought "Good News" to our black brothers and sisters, to leaders of the Sanctuary Coalition, to Dreamers and other migrants, to the poor and the homeless and the already "over-taxed" ordinary people. Like the prophet Jonah who can't abide God's "hesed' (mercy and loving kindness) for all, many of our nation's leaders leave us wondering if they prefer to judge and exclude rather than show compassion and acceptance. So in the midst of the mess of national and global news, how do we "keep the faith"? How do we proclaim the "Good News" of Jesus Christ in a way that brings together people of all races and creeds as "children of God"? How do we announce the Good News in ways that tear down walls rather than building walls to keep the other out? How do we celebrate what the prophet Jonah, presidents and people in power refuse to acknowledge: God's sovereignty in this world and God's desires for justice and mercy for all?

The "Good News" at Xavier is that many of our parishioners are demonstrating their commitment to justice and inclusion through their solidarity with the Sanctuary Coalition and visits to the Elizabeth Detention Center. The work of the Xavier Mission is always a sign of compassion for the most in need. The commemorative March, Feminism and Faith in Union has galvanized women and men in a way that celebrates the gifs of women in our Church and in Civil Society. These are all good reasons to "Keep the Faith!"

Let us pray that together we can find ways of bringing Christ's reconciling love to our world.
