







A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR LADY STAR OF THE SEA CHURCH

Dedicated in 1882, St. Patrick's Cathedral located on the plot of land on North Carancahua now occupied by the American Bank Plaza, became the Cathedral of the Diocese of Corpus Christi when the Diocese was formed in 1912. Leading contributors to the church were Captain Mifflin Kenedy, who donated land, money, and pews. Mrs. Kenedy, who donated the sanctuary windows, and the wife of then Corpus Christi Mayor J. B. Murphy, gave the statues. The ladies of the Altar Society gave the main altar. Various parishioners, in memory of their deceased family members, donated the other stained glass windows. As the Diocese grew, a new cathedral was planned and was dedicated in 1940. St. Patrick's continued to have daily Mass for the children of Incarnate Word Academy then located nearby. In 1951, after it caught fire, the church was dismantled and the sanctuary and main part of the nave were moved to the present location to serve the newly created "Our Lady Star of the Sea" parish. The altar, statues and stained glass windows were saved and reinstalled in the little church. Thus a portion of the old St. Patrick's Cathedral remains standing, a memorial to the pioneers of Corpus Christi. Over the years, the parish has grown to include families from all parts of Corpus Christi, Portland, Gregory, Taft, Aransas Pass and Ingleside who seek a small "country church" atmosphere of worship and fellowship. In addition, our parishioners represent a broad cross-section of cultures and backgrounds from various parts of the United States and a number of foreign countries.

At the conclusion of today's gospel, we hear Jesus tell a "great crowd" that "...anyone of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple." A few of Jesus' immediate disciples, such as Peter, John and James, did just that: They responded to Jesus' call, renouncing everything to follow him. How do modern disciples of Jesus respond when confronted with this apparently harsh command of Jesus? Surely the renunciation of possessions need not mean literally giving all one's possessions away, does it? Questions we might ponder this week though: Do our possessions keep us from encountering Christ at Mass? Do they distract us from our parish family? Do our possessions interfere with our relationships? Do they make us insensitive to those less fortunate?

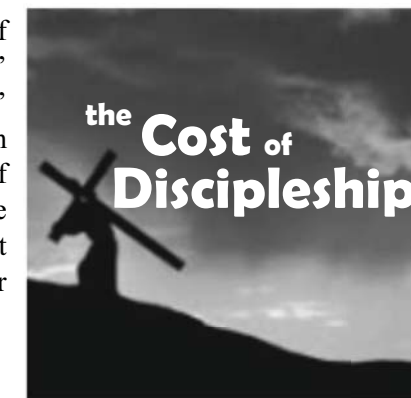
Sunday's Readings:

Wisdom 9:13-18b Trying to understand God's will and put it into practice is a tremendous challenge, but God's Spirit is sent to give us wisdom.

Philemon 9-10, 12-17 Paul is writing to Philemon on behalf of the runaway slave Onesimus, who has become a Christian and is now returning to his Christian owner. He talks about treating Onesimus as a brother and no longer as a slave. Catholic Social Teaching, based on the dignity of the human person., stresses that no person can be the possession of another. No person's value is found in what they own or control or possess.

Luke 14:25-33 Jesus calls on potential disciples to be clear about what discipleship can require. Jesus seems to be saying that if you do not know your limits, you will end up doing "stupid things." You end up building a house which you cannot finish. You end up fighting a war that you cannot win. You end up attaching excessive value to your possessions. You will end up not doing the life giving thing God wants. Count the cost of discipleship, be aware of what holding your true values can demand, before you say yes.
