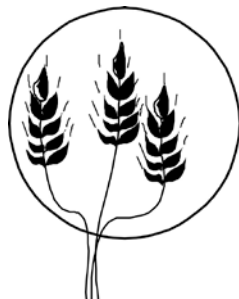

A CALL FOR YOUR GENEROSITY: According to Feeding America across America (this includes New Jersey) 48.8 million including 16.230 million children live in households that lack in the means to get enough nutritious food on a regular basis. As a result 1 in 5 children go hungry at some time during the year.

The reality is right here in our area kids lack food especially during the summer months. This is a time when families can't rely on free or reduced lunch programs to pick up some of the burden of feeding their children.

Our Catholic Charities Food Pantries throughout the Diocese of Paterson is one of the most important sources of food for literally thousands of our brother and sisters in need - particularly children. So we ask everyone that comes to Mass to bring one food item, paper products or personal toiletry item. You make a big difference in a family's life one item at a time.

ABOUT ONE OF OUR CATHOLIC CHARITIES

FOOD PANTRY: **The Father English Consumer Choice Food Pantry (FECC Food Pantry)** is open Monday-Wednesday and Friday from 9:00am-12:00pm. The pantry is open on Thursday evenings from 3:30pm-5:30pm to accommodate working families. Low income families and individuals are eligible to visit our "Consumer Choice" Food Pantry once a month. The food pantry addresses Community Living Services, allowing households to offset food costs. The Food Pantry serves approximately 700 families on a monthly basis. Many clients are minimum-wage earners who stretch income to cover expenses such as rent, gas and electric, and medical bills. The families are single moms, senior citizens, individuals on disability, the homeless, veterans, and working class people who don't make enough to meet monthly expenses.

The FECC Food Pantry allows individuals and families to choose their own groceries, using a point system that is based on family size, income, and monthly expenses. Clients are allowed to go through the aisles with a shopping cart pick products off the shelf, much as they would at a typical supermarket. This gives them a sense of ownership, empowerment, respect and dignity, in allowing them to choose products' that most meet their individual family needs. The Statewide Emergency Food and Anti-Hunger Network named our Food Pantry, the model food pantry for the State of New Jersey.
