### **ABOUT ONE OF OUR CATHOLIC CHARITIES**

**FOOD PANTRY: HOPE HOUSE FOOD PANTRY** is open Monday-Wednesday from 9:30am-12:00pm. The pantry is open on Thursday evenings from 4:00pm-6:00pm to accommodate working families. Low income families and individuals are eligible to visit our "Consumer Choice" Food Pantry a maximum of two times each month. An appointment with the Food Pantry Coordinator is required. Non-perishable groceries and personal hygiene items are available year round. During the summer months a selection of vegetables grown in our own community garden is also available. The food pantry is staffed by caring volunteers, who assist the clients with the selection of groceries. Volunteers also plant, maintain and harvest the community garden. Approximately **65% of the food distributed annually is donated by churches, businesses, schools and individuals.**

The Hope House Food Pantry is a member of the Community Foodbank of NJ, and we receive an additional 33% of our refrigerated and frozen items. The remaining 2% of the food distributed is through community partnerships and supermarket gift cards that we receive from the kind donors that support the work of the food pantry.
