## PARISH MINISTRIES

**SAFETY AND SECURITY MINISTRY:** Creating a Culture of Safety & Security: Do you know your Emergency Exit Locations? We are all creatures of habit. Weekly, we enter St. Thomas or St. John's through the main entrance and go to where we normally sit. In many emergency situations such as fire or active shooter, the main entrance may be blocked or is too far away.

We ask you to take a few minutes and locate the emergency exits.

For St. Thomas

- There are emergency exits on either side of the organ
- Another emergency exit at the back of the kitchen
- If you enter St. Thomas to go the office, that's another emergency exit.
- Another emergency exit door is located down the office corridor. You can also get to this door by traveling through the Social Hall and make a right.
- There is an emergency exit located inside classroom 4.
- Lastly, the main entrance door is also an emergency exit.

There is no emergency exit if you travel up the steps to the stage! We marked certain doors as "No Exit".

For St. John's

- The main entrance door is an emergency exit.
- There are 2 emergency exit doors. One is on the left side; the other is on the right side of the pew sections. The doors are closer to the altar than the main exit.

If you need to evacuate, always travel to the nearest door. Push in the bar across any door with either your hands or body to open emergency doors!

Please pray for the victims of the nearest mass shootings in Texas and Ohio.

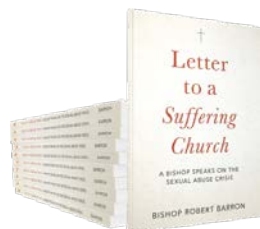
