FIRE AT STRAIGHT AND NARROW

On August 24th Straight and Narrow's 410 facility was destroyed by a fire. Thankfully, none of our service recipients or staff members were harmed. Please keep the Straight and Narrow Family in your prayers during this time.

With your help, we will rebuild and continue to provide help and create hope for those in recovery.

50 people in recovery at our Halfway House lost many of their possessions in the Straight and Narrow Fire on August 24th. The items lost include:

2 guitars • Game systems: PS4/Xbox • Phone chargers: Android, and iPhone • Wireless headphones • Cologne • Reading Glasses (200) Belts of various sizes • Electronic razors and buzzers • Bibles • Board games for adults: ie: dominoes, chess, checkers, playing cards •
